16 17	(i) Successfully completed and passed a training program and any required refresher program approved by the Department;
	(ii) Successfully completed and passed a training program and any required refresher program approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency; or
21 22	(iii) Acquired and maintained current accreditation from an EPA-approved state accreditation plan of another state.
25	(3) The Department may accept as proof of accreditation a certificate showing successful completion of any approved training program and any required refresher program [or by proof of national registration with the National Asbestos Council's AHERA State Certification Reciprocity Registration Program].
	(b) (1) The Department shall adopt regulations establishing standards and procedures that are consistent with federal law for the accreditation of asbestos occupations.
30	(2) The regulations shall include standards for:
31	(i) Training course approval and review;
32	(ii) Examinations for accreditation of applicants;
33	(iii) Annual refresher courses and renewal of accreditation;
34	(iv) Denial, suspension, and revocation of accreditation; and
35	(v) Procedures for implementing this accreditation plan

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- 1 (c) The Department shall set reasonable fees sufficient to cover the Department's
- 2 direct and indirect costs in approving training programs, including thecost of
- 3 applications, issuance and renewal of training course approvals and reviews, on-site
- 4 audits, recordkeeping, and other related activities.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 6 June 1, 1996.
