## 1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 District Court - Civil Jurisdiction

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the civil jurisdiction of the District Court to include certain
- 4 cases involving not more than a certain amount in controversy; providing that
- 5 certain amounts in controversy that determine whether the District Court has
- 6 jurisdiction in certain cases shall be exclusive of costs and interest; providing that a
- 7 certain amount in controversy that determines whether the District Court and a trial
- 8 court of general jurisdiction have concurrent jurisdiction in certain cases shall be
- 9 exclusive of costs and interest; providing for the application of this Act; and
- 10 generally relating to the civil jurisdiction of the District Court.

### 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 18 Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

19 4-401.

- 20 Except as provided in § 4-402 of this subtitle, and subject to the venue provisions of
- 21 Title 6 of this article, the District Court has exclusive original civil jurisdiction in:
- 22 (1) An action in contract or tort, if the debt or damages claimed do not
- 23 exceed [\$20,000] \$30,000, exclusive of INTEREST, COSTS, AND attorney's fees if
- 24 attorney's fees are recoverable by law or contract;
- 25 (3) A matter of attachment before judgment, if the sum claimed does not
- 26 exceed [\$20,000] \$30,000, exclusive of INTEREST, COSTS, AND attorney's fees if
- 27 attorney's fees are recoverable by law or contract;
- 28 4-402.
- 29 (d) (1) (i) Except in a case under paragraph (2), (4), (5), or (6) of § 4-401 of
- 30 this subtitle, the plaintiff may elect to file suit in the District Court or in a trial court of

- 1 general jurisdiction, if the amount in controversy exceeds \$2,500, exclusive of INTEREST,
- 2 COSTS, AND attorney's fees if attorney's fees are recoverable by law or contract.
- 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed
- 4 only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or
- 5 application to any case filed before the effective date of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 1996.
