12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 14 Article Education
- 15 5-110.
- 16 (a) This section does not apply to:

17 (1) Baltimore City;

(2) Contracts for the purchase of books and other materials of instruction asdefined in the State Department of Education Financial Reporting Manual; and

20 (3) Emergency repairs [required during the regular school year].

1 (b) (1) If the cost of any school building, improvement, supplies, or equipment 2 is more than \$15,000, the county board, at least 2 weeks before bids are to be filed, shall 3 advertise for bids in at least one newspaper of general circulation in the county.

16 (d) (1) In this subsection, the term "minority business enterprise" has the 17 meaning stated in § 14-301 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.	

18 (2) In Montgomery County, by resolution and by implementing regulations,

19 the Montgomery County Board of Education shall establish a minority business utilization

20 program to facilitate the participation of responsible certified minority business

21 enterprises in contracts awarded by the Montgomery County Board of Education in

22 accordance with competitive bidding procedures.

23 (e) A contract entered into or purchase made in violation of this section is void.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 25 October 1, 1996.
