## 2 **Education - State Grant for Transportation Services**

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the method of calculating the amount of a State grant for
- 4 public school transportation; defining a certain term; and generally relating to a

- 6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 13 **Article - Education**
- 14 5-203.
- 15 (b) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT"
- 16 MEANS THE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT USED TO CALCULATE THE
- 17 STATE SHARE OF BASIC CURRENT EXPENSES FOR A FISCAL YEAR UNDER § 5-202 OF
- 18 THIS SUBTITLE.
- (2) Subject to the limitations under paragraph [(2)] (3) of this subsection,
- 20 for fiscal year [1994] 1997 and every year thereafter the amount of thegrant shall be
- 21 equal to the amount of the grant for the previous year increased by thesame percentage
- 22 as the increase in the private transportation category of the Consumer Price Index for all

- 1 urban consumers, for the Baltimore metropolitan area, as of July of thesecond fiscal year
- 2 preceding the year for which the amount is being calculated, PLUS AN ADDITIONAL
- 3 AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE PRODUCT OF:
- 4 (I) THE TOTAL STATE GRANT FOR SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION
- 5 FOR THE PREVIOUS FISCAL YEAR DIVIDED BY THE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT
- 6 ENROLLMENT FOR THE PREVIOUS FISCAL YEAR; AND
- 7 (II) THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT
- 8 ENROLLMENT IN A COUNTY FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR AND THE FULL-TIME
- 9 EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT IN THE COUNTY FOR THE PREVIOUS FISCAL YEAR, OR,
- 10 IF THE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT IN A COUNTY FOR THE CURRENT
- 11 FISCAL YEAR IS LESS THAN THE FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT IN THE
- 12 COUNTY FOR THE PREVIOUS FISCAL YEAR, ZERO.
- [(2)] (3) The increase in the amount of the grant THAT IS BASEDON THE
- 14 INCREASE IN THE PRIVATE TRANSPORTATION CATEGORY OF THE CONSUMER PRICE
- 15 INDEX may not be less than 3 percent nor more than 8 percent of the amount of the grant
- 16 for the previous year.
- 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 18 October 1, 1996.
