16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments**

19 [2-401.

20 The Governor may remit the whole or any part of any recognizance which may be
21 forfeited; provided, the judge of the court in which such forfeiture took place shall
22 recommend the remission of the whole or some part thereof.]

2 The Governor may remit the whole or any part of any fine or forfeiture. HOWEVER,
3 A DEFENDANT OR SURETY APPLYING FOR THE REMISSION OF THE WHOLE OR ANY
4 PART OF A RECOGNIZANCE WHICH HAS BEEN FORFEITED SHALL APPLY TO A COURT
5 TO ORDER THE REMISSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH TITLE 4 OF THE MARYLAND
6 RULES, AND NEED NOT APPLY TO THE GOVERNOR TO ORDER THE REMISSION.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
8 October 1, 1996.
