- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "dealer" in certain provisions of law
- 4 relating to plant disease control; authorizing the Secretary of Agriculture to impose
- 5 a civil penalty on any person who violates the Plant Disease ControlLaw; and
- 6 generally relating to the Plant Disease Control Law.

## 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

# 19 Article - Agriculture

20 5-301.

- 21 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 22 (b) "Broker" means any person who solicits, takes orders, sells or distributes
- 23 nursery stock in the State other than a nurseryman or dealer.
- 24 (c) (1) "Dealer" means any person, except a nurseryman or broker, who [buys,
- 25 collects,] ADVERTISES NURSERY STOCK FOR SALE OR INSTALLATION OR WHO BUYS,
- 26 COLLECTS, or otherwise acquires wild plants or nursery stock for the purpose of selling,
- 27 planting or distributing them.
- 28 (2) "Dealer" does not include a person who acquires plants for personal use.

- 1 (d) "Nursery stock" means (1) any hardy plant or plant that survivesMaryland
- 2 winters, including a deciduous or evergreen tree, shrub, or woody vine whether cultivated,
- 3 native, or wild, and all viable parts of the plant; (2) any nonhardy plant or plant part to be
- 4 distributed in another state that requires plant inspection and certification before
- 5 entering that state; and (3) any other plant included by the Secretary,if regulating its
- 6 movement is necessary to control any dangerously injurious plant pest.
- 7 (e) "Nursery" means any place where nursery stock is produced for sale or 8 distribution.
- 9 (f) "Nurseryman" means any person engaged in the production of nursery stock 10 for sale or distribution.
- 11 (g) "Plant pest" means any insect, snail, nematode, fungus, virus, bacteria, weed,
- 12 or any other form of terrestrial or aquatic plant or microorganisms (except viruses,
- 13 bacteria, or other microorganisms on or in living man or another livinganimal) which is
- 14 normally considered to be a plant pest or which the Secretary declares to be a pest.

- 16 (A) INSTEAD OF ANY OTHER PENALTY AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS ARTICLE,
- 17 THE SECRETARY MAY IMPOSE, ON ANY PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF
- 18 THIS SUBTITLE OR ANY ORDER WHICH THE SECRETARY HAS ISSUED UNDER THIS
- 19 SUBTITLE, A CIVIL PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$500 FOR EACH VIOLATION.
- 20 (B) PENALTIES COLLECTED BY THE SECRETARY UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL
- 21 BE PAID INTO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.
- 22 (C) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THE
- 23 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.
- 24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 25 October 1, 1996.
