A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Personnel - Child Support Enforcement Administration - Transfer of Personnel

- 3 FOR the purpose of transferring the Paternity and Support Division of the Office of the
- 4 State's Attorney for Washington County to the Child Support Enforcement
- 5 Administration of the Department of Human Resources; providing that certain
- 6 employees shall be transferred in accordance with certain provisions of law that
- 7 provide for classified status, seniority, compensation, annual leaveaccrual, transfer
- 8 of certain pension contributions, and other personnel matters for employees
- 9 transferring to the Child Support Enforcement Administration; requiring
- Washington County to pay certain personnel certain moneys as of a certain date;
- requiring the creation of certain Position Identification Numbers for certain
- transferred employees; and generally relating to the transfer of certain personnel to
- the Department of Human Resources.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 21 Article Family Law
- 22 10-117.
- 23 (a) A county or circuit court with a local support enforcement office may request
- 24 that the responsibility for support enforcement be transferred to the Administration.
- 25 (b) A request for transfer of responsibility under this section must be made to the
- 26 Department of Human Resources by September 1 of the year preceding the fiscal year for
- 27 which responsibility will be transferred.
- 28 (c) Any personnel of the local support enforcement office involved in a transfer
- 29 under this section shall become classified service employees of this State and shall be
- 30 placed in the position that is comparable to or most closely compares to their former
- 31 position, without further examination or qualification. These employeesshall be credited

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- 1 with the years of service with the jurisdiction for the purpose of determining leave
- 2 accumulation and shall become members of the Employees' Pension System of the State
- 3 of Maryland. All previous pension contributions shall be transferred inaccordance with
- 4 Title 37 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article. These employees shall receive no
- 5 diminution in compensation or accumulated leave solely as a result of the transfer.
- 6 Annual leave in excess of that which may be retained annually in the State Personnel
- 7 Management System may be retained at the time of transfer if that accumulation was
- 8 permitted by the former employer.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on October 1, 1996, all
- 10 the functions, powers, and duties of the Paternity and Support Divisionof the Office of
- 11 the State's Attorney for Washington County and the personnel indicated in Section 3 of
- 12 this Act shall be transferred to the Child Support Enforcement Administration of the
- 13 Department of Human Resources.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

- 15 (1) Except for the Assistant State's Attorney, all employees of the Paternity
- 16 and Support Division of the Office of the State's Attorney for Washington County shall
- 17 be transferred to the Child Support Enforcement Administration of the Department of
- 18 Human Resources in accordance with the provisions of § 10-117(c) of the Family Law
- 19 Article.

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- 20 (2) Except for the Assistant State's Attorney, a Position Identification
- 21 Number (PIN) shall be created for each transferred employee in a State classification
- 22 commensurate with the employee's salary grade at the time of the transfer.
- 23 (3) It shall be the responsibility of Washington County to pay to each
- 24 employee transferred under this section any money due to the employee on termination
- 25 of County employment as of September 30, 1996.
- 26 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 July 1, 1996.
