3 FOR the purpose of altering provisions relating to the regulation of pilots; adding a third			
4 category of limited license; setting a duration of validity for all limited licenses;			
5 establishing a fee for a limited license; creating a certain limitedlicense; providing			
6 reduced retirement payments for inactive pilots within a certain range of years of			
7 service <u>under certain circumstances</u> ; providing for physicians to certify disability of			
8 a pilot; altering the rate of compensation for a detained pilot; making a stylistic			
9 change; and generally relating to pilots.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF			
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(b) "Apprentice pilot" means an individual who is engaged in training, under the			
22 supervision of a licensed pilot, to provide pilotage.

14	(h) "Pilot" means an individual who provides pilotage.
	(i) (1) "Provide pilotage" means to pilot a vessel under the provisions of this title when the vessel is underway on the navigable waters of the State,including when the vessel is towing or being towed by another vessel.
18	(2) "Provide pilotage" does not include:
19	(i) maneuvering a vessel during berthing or unberthing operations; or
20 21	(ii) shifting a vessel within a port with tug assistance and a docking master aboard the vessel.

23	Subject to the provisions of this subtitle, the Board may issue:
24	(1) a license;
25	(2) A 37-FOOT-DRAFT LIMITED LICENSE;
26	[(2)] (3) a 34-foot-draft limited license; and

29 30	(a) To qualify for a limited license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
31	(b) An applicant shall have trained as an apprentice pilot for at least 2 years.
	(c) An applicant shall possess sufficient ability, skill, and experience for a 28-foot-draft limited license [or], a 34-foot-draft limited license, ORA 37-FOOT-DRAFT LIMITED LICENSE as determined by the Board through observation of

2	(a) If an applicant qualifies for a license under this subtitle, theBoard shall send the applicant a notice that states that:

	(b) (1) WHILE A 37-FOOT-DRAFT LIMITED LICENSE IS IN EFFECT, IT AUTHORIZES THE LICENSEE TO PROVIDE PILOTAGE FOR VESSELS NOT EXCEEDING 37-FOOT-DRAFT.
20 21	(2) While a 34-foot-draft limited license is in effect, it authorizes the licensee to provide pilotage for vessels not exceeding 34-foot-draft.
22 23	[(2)] (3) While a 28-foot-draft limited license is in effect, it authorizes the licensee to provide pilotage for vessels not exceeding 28-foot-draft.

25 26	(a) Unless a license is renewed for a 2-year term as provided in this section, the license expires on the first May 30 that comes:
27	(1) after the effective date of the license; and
28	(2) in an even-numbered year.
29 30	(b) At least 1 month before a license expires, the Board shall mail to the licensee, at the last known address of the licensee:
