- 3 [TAG ftpo]FOR the purpose of altering the eligibility requirements concerning the education and
- 4 experience to qualify for the National Council of Interior Design Qualification
- 5 Examination for certification under the Maryland Certified Interior Designers Act;
- 6 altering certain reinstatement requirements to allow for reinstatement of
- 7 certification at any time provided that the certificate holder completes two
- 8 continuing education units in courses that the Board approves; and generally
- 9 relating to certification of interior designers.

10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 Article - Business Occupations and Professions

18 8-302.

(a) To qualify for a certificate, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the20 requirements of this section.

- 21 (b) The applicant shall be of good character and reputation.
- 22 (c) The applicant shall be at least 18 years old.

[(d) The applicant shall: (1) have completed a 4-year course of study in interior design at and be 3 graduated from a college or school of interior design that: (i) is approved by the Board; and (ii) holds accredited status from the Foundation for Interior Design 6 Education Research or its equivalent, as determined by the Board; and (2) have at least 2 years of practical experience in interior design that is 8 satisfactory to the Board; (3) except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, pass or havepassed the 10 National Council of Interior Design Qualification Examination, or its equivalent, as 11 determined by the Board; and (4) at the time of certification, meet any other standard or requirement by 13 the National Council of Interior Design Qualification, the Foundation for Interior Design 14 Education Research, or an equivalent institution, as determined by the Board.] (D) THE APPLICANT SHALL: (1) FILE AN APPLICATION AND PAY AN APPLICATION FEE IN 17 ACCORDANCE WITH § 8-303 OF THIS SUBTITLE; (2) HAVE SATISFIED ELIGIBILITY EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE 19 REQUIREMENTS WITH REGARD TO THE APPROPRIATE EDUCATION AND 20 EXPERIENCE NECESSARY TO QUALIFY FOR THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF INTERIOR 21 DESIGN QUALIFICATION EXAMINATION, OR ITS EQUIVALENT, AS DETERMINED BY 22 THE BOARD: AND (3) HAVE PASSED THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF INTERIOR DESIGN 24 QUALIFICATION EXAMINATION, OR ITS EQUIVALENT. 25 8-309. (a) [Within 1 year after expiration, the] THE Board shall reinstate the certificate 27 of an interior designer who has failed to renew the certificate for anyreason if the interior 28 designer: (1) meets the renewal requirements, including payment of a renewal fee, 30 under § 8-307 of this subtitle; (2) pays to the Board the reinstatement fee as set by the Board; [and] (3) submits to the Board a reinstatement application on the form that the 33 Board provides; AND (4) EARNS TWO CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS IN COURSES 35 APPROVED BY THE BOARD IN A 2-YEAR PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE 36 REQUEST FOR REINSTATEMENT.

- 37 (b) The Board may extend the reinstatement period for an interior designer if the
- 38 interior designer shows good cause for the extension.

- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 2 October 1, 1996.
