A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

**2 Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 1996, Maryland
3 Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1990, 1991, 1992, 1993, and 1994, Water Quality
4 Loans of 1974 and 1983, Chesapeake Bay Water Quality Loans of 1984, 1985, 1986, 1987,
5 and 1988, and Controlled Hazardous Substance Loans of 1986, 1987, and 1988**

6 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Three
7 Hundred Seventy-Five Million, Eight Hundred Seventy-Six Thousand Dollars
8 (\$375,876,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, construction,
9 demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment
10 purchases of this State, and for acquiring certain real estate in connection
11 therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain
12 purposes subject to the requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching
13 funds of a certain type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and
14 sale of bonds evidencing the loan; providing for certain unexpended appropriations
15 in prior Capital Budgets and Bond Acts to be expended for other public projects;
16 providing that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior Capital Budgets and
17 Bond Acts be reduced by certain amounts; extending the time on the availability of
18 funds for certain unexpended appropriations in prior Capital Budgets; and
19 generally relating to the financing of certain capital projects.

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
11 MARYLAND, That:

12 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
13 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as theMaryland
14 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 1996 in the total principal amount of\$375,876,000.
15 This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation
16 bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and
17 delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the State Finance and
18 Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

19 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan maybe sold as a
20 single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under
21 Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

22 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and
23 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the
24 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on
25 the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works,
26 for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects'and engineers' fees:
