- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 Article - State Finance and Procurement

- 15 (a) In this section, "small procurement" means a procurement for which:
- 16 (1) a unit spends [\$10,000] \$25,000 or less; or
- 17 (2) a contractor provides services subject to § 11-202(3) of this article for 18 expected annual revenues of [\$10,000] \$25,000 or less.
- 19 (b) A unit may make small procurements in accordance with the regulations of 20 primary procurement units.
- 21 (c) A primary procurement unit may not create a small procurement byartificial
- 22 division of a procurement.
- 23 (d) Any regulation of a primary procurement unit to govern small procurements:
- 24 (1) shall provide for a simplified administrative procedure;
- 25 (2) shall be consistent with the basic intent of this Division II; and
- 26 (3) may not be disadvantageous economically to the State.

- 1 (e) At least every 3 years, the Board shall:
- 2 (1) review the prevailing costs of labor and materials; and
- 3 (2) if warranted by changes in cost, recommend to the General Assembly4 appropriate adjustments in the ceiling for a small procurement.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 1996.
