11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 Article - State Finance and Procurement

15 (b) Subject to the authority of the Board, jurisdiction over procurement is as 16 follows:

17 (5) the University of Maryland System, without the approval of any of the18 other primary procurement units, may engage in the procurement of:

(i) supplies for the University, including motor vehicles and, to theextent provided by Title 3, Subtitle 4 of this article, information processing supplies, butexcluding[:

- 22 1. supplies funded by the proceeds from State general23 obligation bonds; and
- 24 2.] insurance;

(ii) services for the University, including information processing
services to the extent provided in Title 3, Subtitle 4 of this article, but excluding banking
and financial services under the authority of the State Treasurer underitem (1) of this
section;

1 (iii) construction and construction related services for the University, 2 regardless of the source of funds, to the extent that the Board grants authority over

3 specific projects or classes of projects; and

4 (iv) leases of real property for the University if the lease payments are 5 not paid from the General Fund of the State;

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 July 1, 1996.
