- 2 Volunteer Fire Company Officers Emergency Equipment on Private Vehicles
- 3 [TAG ftpo]FOR the purpose of clarifying that the highest ranking fireline officer and the certain
- 4 officers of the next highest rank that is second in command in a volunteer fire
- 5 company may have their privately owned vehicles equipped with red lights or signal
- 6 devices which may be displayed under certain circumstances; limiting the maximum
- 7 <u>number of officers in a volunteer fire company who may have their privately owned</u>
- 8 vehicles equipped with red lights or signal devices which may be displayed under
- 9 <u>certain circumstances</u>; and generally relating to red lights or signal devices on
- 10 privately owned vehicles of volunteer fire company officers.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 18 **Article Transportation**
- 19 22-218.
- 20 (c) A person may not drive or move on any highway any vehicle or equipment that
- 21 is equipped with or displays any light or signal device designed to emit an oscillating,
- 22 rotating, blinking, or other type of emission of light, unless designated and authorized by

- 1 the Administrator as indicated in paragraphs (1) through (9) of this subsection. The
- 2 provisions of this section do not prohibit the display and use of any lighting device that
- 3 may be permitted or required elsewhere in the Maryland Vehicle Law.
- 4 (2) (ii) The fire chief[, the assistant fire chief] OR HIGHEST RANKING
- 5 FIRELINE OFFICER, THE OFFICERS OF THE NEXT HIGHEST RANK, and the emergency
- 6 medical services commander for IN each volunteer fire company[,] NO MORE THAN
- 7 FIVE OF THE FOLLOWING OFFICERS may have their privately owned vehicles equipped
- 8 with red lights or signal devices which may be displayed only while on route to or at the
- 9 scene of an emergency:
- 10 <u>1. THE FIRE CHIEF OR THE HIGHEST RANKING FIRELINE</u>
- 11 OFFICER;
- 12 2. ONE OR MORE OF THE ASSISTANT CHIEFS OR DEPUTY
- 13 CHIEFS, WHICHEVER RANK IS SECOND IN COMMAND; AND
- 14 <u>3. THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES COMMANDER.</u>
- 15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 16 October 1, 1996.
