3 FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that each employee of a local board of

- supervisors of elections be a resident of the county where the boardis located; and 4
- retaining the residency requirement for the chief administrator of each board. 5

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 Article 33 - Election Code

14 2-6.

15 (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, thissection 16 applies to all employees of an election board, including clerks, registrars, stenographers, 17 and voting machine operators.

18 (2) Subsections (a) through (f) of this section do not apply to any attorney to 19 an election board or to any election judge, by any title.

(b) This section does not alter, in any way, the method by which thesalaries of the 20

21 employees to which this section applies are currently funded by the various counties

22 under this article.

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1	(c) (1) If the employees of a board are covered by a county merit system:
2 3	(i) The employees shall be classified employees under the county merit system; and
4 5	(ii) The board may appoint and remove the employees subject to the rules and regulations of the personnel officials of the county where the board is located.
6	(2) If the employees of a board are not covered by a county merit system:
7 8	(i) The employees shall be in the classified service of the State Personnel Management System; and
	(ii) The board may appoint and remove the employees in accordance with the provisions of the State Personnel and Pensions Article that govern classified service employees.
12	(d) (1) Each employee[:
13	(1) Shall] SHALL be a registered voter of the State[; and].
	(2) Shall <u>THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR OF A BOARD SHALL</u> be a resident of the county where the board is located and maintain that residency while employed by the board].
17	(e) While in office or employed by a board, an employee may not:
18	(1) Hold any public office or office in a political party;
19	(2) Be a candidate for any public office or office in a political party;
20 21	(3) Use the employee's official authority or influence to interfere with or affect the result of an election; or
22	(4) Actively participate in political management or political campaigns.
23 24	(f) In Baltimore City, the board may not have more than 45 employeesor the number set by the Secretary of Personnel.
25	(g) An election judge or an attorney to an election board may not be:
26	(1) A candidate for any public office or office in a political party;
27	(2) A campaign manager for a candidate; or
28	(3) A treasurer for a candidate or political committee.
29	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

30 October 1, 1996.

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
