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A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Nurses - Exercise of Professional Judgment**

3 FOR the purpose of providing grounds for disciplining a supervisory nurse directing  
4 another nurse to perform an act or take an assignment that the nurse has refused  
5 for certain reasons; creating a certain exception for emergencies under which the  
6 nurse should do the act or accept the assignment; providing grounds for disciplining  
7 a supervisory nurse for interfering with, inhibiting, or preventing another nurse  
8 from refusing to accept certain responsibility or do a certain act; prohibiting a  
9 certain person from interfering with, inhibiting, or preventing another nurse from  
10 refusing to accept certain responsibility or do a certain act; creating a certain  
11 exception for emergencies under which the nurse should accept responsibility or do  
12 the act; authorizing a certain board to discipline a certain licensee or certificate  
13 holder in a certain manner for violating a certain prohibition; exempting a certain  
14 licensee or certificate holder from discipline under a certain provision; authorizing  
15 a certain person to create and a certain board to approve certain performance  
16 protocols; exempting a person in compliance with a certain performance protocol  
17 from a certain disciplinary provision; subjecting a person not in compliance with a  
18 certain performance protocol to a certain disciplinary provision; and generally  
19 relating to the exercise of professional judgment by nurses.

4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
5 MARYLAND, That Section(s) 8-316(b) through (d), respectively, of Article - Health  
6 Occupations of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s)  
7 8-316(c) through (e), respectively.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland  
9 read as follows:

10 **Article - Health Occupations**

11 8-316.

12 (a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 8-317 of this subtitle, the Board may  
13 deny a license to any applicant, reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation,  
14 or suspend or revoke the license of a licensee if the applicant or licensee:

15 (27) Practices registered nursing or licensed practical nursing without a  
16 license before obtaining or renewing a license, including any period when the license or a  
17 temporary license of the applicant or licensee has lapsed; [or]

18 (28) After failing to renew a license or after a temporary license has lapsed,  
19 commits any act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under this section[.];

20 (29) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION,  
21 DIRECTS ANOTHER NURSE TO PERFORM AN ACT OR ACCEPT AN ASSIGNMENT THAT  
22 THE NURSE ACTING AS A REASONABLE AND PRUDENT NURSE EXERCISING SOUND  
23 NURSING JUDGMENT HAS REFUSED TO PERFORM:

24 (I) BECAUSE THE ACT OR ASSIGNMENT IS NOT WITHIN THE  
25 NURSE'S PREPARATION, CAPABILITIES, AND EXPERIENCE; OR

26 (II) BECAUSE THE ASSIGNMENT, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT THE  
27 NURSE'S PREPARATION, CAPABILITIES, AND EXPERIENCE, IS NOT SUPPLEMENTED  
28 BY ANOTHER NURSE HAVING THE PREPARATION, CAPABILITIES, AND EXPERIENCE  
29 TO PERFORM THE ASSIGNMENT IN A SAFE AND COMPETENT MANNER; OR

30 (30) INTERFERES WITH, INHIBITS, OR PREVENTS ANOTHER NURSE'S  
31 REFUSAL TO ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY FOR SUPERVISING,  
32 MONITORING, INSTRUCTING, OR EVALUATING AN UNLICENSED INDIVIDUAL  
33 PERFORMING A NURSING TASK, ACT, OR RESPONSIBILITY, WHEN THE UNLICENSED  
34 INDIVIDUAL HAS NOT DEMONSTRATED IN THE NURSE'S PROFESSIONAL NURSING  
35 JUDGMENT THE KNOWLEDGE, EXPERIENCE, PREPARATION, AND ABILITY TO  
36 PERFORM THE NURSING TASK, ACT, OR RESPONSIBILITY IN A SAFE AND COMPETENT  
37 MANNER.

38 (B) (1) FOR THE PURPOSES OF PARAGRAPH (A)(29) OF THIS SECTION, IF AN  
39 EMERGENCY SITUATION PRESENTING A CLEAR AND SIGNIFICANT RISK OF DEATH,

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1 SERIOUS INJURY, OR HARM TO A PATIENT EXISTS, THE NURSE SHALL PERFORM THE  
2 ACT OR ACCEPT THE ASSIGNMENT.

3 (2) SHOULD AN EMERGENCY SITUATION UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF  
4 THIS SUBSECTION RESULT FROM RECURRING AND REASONABLY ANTICIPATED  
5 CONDITIONS, THE DIRECTING NURSE IS SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINE UNDER THIS  
6 SECTION.

7 8-708.

8 (A) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, A  
9 PERSON MAY NOT INTERFERE WITH, INHIBIT, OR PREVENT A NURSE'S REFUSAL:

10 (1) TO ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY FOR  
11 SUPERVISING, MONITORING, INSTRUCTING, OR EVALUATING AN UNLICENSED  
12 INDIVIDUAL PERFORMING A NURSING TASK, ACT, OR RESPONSIBILITY WHEN THE  
13 UNLICENSED INDIVIDUAL HAS NOT DEMONSTRATED IN THE NURSE'S  
14 PROFESSIONAL JUDGMENT THE KNOWLEDGE, EXPERIENCE, PREPARATION, AND  
15 ABILITY TO PERFORM THE TASK, ACT, OR RESPONSIBILITY IN A SAFE AND  
16 COMPETENT MANNER; OR

17 (2) TO PERFORM AN ACT OR ACCEPT AN ASSIGNMENT THAT IS NOT  
18 WITHIN THE NURSE'S PREPARATION, CAPABILITIES, AND EXPERIENCE AFTER THE  
19 NURSE HAS INFORMED THE PERSON THAT THE ACT OR ASSIGNMENT IS NOT WITHIN  
20 THE NURSE'S PREPARATION, CAPABILITIES, AND EXPERIENCE.

21 (B) (1) FOR THE PURPOSES OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, IF AN  
22 EMERGENCY SITUATION PRESENTING A CLEAR AND SIGNIFICANT RISK OF DEATH,  
23 SERIOUS INJURY, OR HARM TO A PATIENT EXISTS, THE NURSE SHALL PERFORM THE  
24 ACT OR ACCEPT THE ASSIGNMENT.

25 (2) SHOULD AN EMERGENCY SITUATION UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF  
26 THIS SUBSECTION RESULT FROM RECURRING AND REASONABLY ANTICIPATED  
27 CONDITIONS, THE PERSON INTERFERING WITH, INHIBITING, OR PREVENTING A  
28 NURSE'S REFUSAL IS SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

29 8-710.

30 (a) Except for a violation of § 8-707 of this subtitle, a person who violates any  
31 provision of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine  
32 not exceeding \$5,000 or imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or both.

33 (b) A person who violates any provision of § 8-707 of this subtitle is guilty of a  
34 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject:

35 (1) For a first offense, to a fine not exceeding \$100; and

36 (2) For any subsequent violation of the same provision, to a fine not  
37 exceeding \$500 or imprisonment not exceeding 6 months or both.

38 (C) (1) SUBJECT TO THE APPROPRIATE HEARING AND APPEAL PROVISIONS,  
39 THE APPROPRIATE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS BOARD, ON THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF  
40 A MAJORITY OF ITS MEMBERS MAY REPRIMAND A LICENSEE OR CERTIFICATE

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1 HOLDER, PLACE A LICENSEE OR CERTIFICATE HOLDER ON PROBATION, OR  
2 SUSPEND OR REVOKE A LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE OF A PERSON WHO VIOLATES §  
3 8-708 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

4 (2) A PERSON WHO IS LICENSED, CERTIFIED, OR OTHERWISE  
5 AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE HEALTH CARE SERVICES UNDER THIS ARTICLE IS NOT  
6 SUBJECT TO THE PENALTY PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

7 (D) A PERSON WHO IS EMPLOYED IN A SUPERVISORY CAPACITY IN AN  
8 ACCREDITED HOSPITAL AS DEFINED IN § 19-301(B) OF THE HEALTH-GENERAL  
9 ARTICLE AND WHO IS LICENSED, CERTIFIED, OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED TO  
10 PROVIDE HEALTH CARE SERVICES UNDER THIS ARTICLE IS NOT SUBJECT TO THE  
11 PENALTY PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

12 (E) (1) A HOSPITAL, RELATED INSTITUTION, ANY OTHER ENTITY, OR  
13 PERSON WHICH EMPLOYS A NURSE MAY DEVELOP AND SUBMIT TO THE BOARD FOR  
14 ITS APPROVAL, WRITTEN PROTOCOLS GOVERNING AN EMPLOYEE NURSE'S  
15 PERFORMANCE OF ACTS, ACCEPTANCE OF ASSIGNMENTS, AND RESPONSIBILITY,  
16 AND ACCOUNTABILITY FOR SUPERVISING, MONITORING, INSTITUTING, OR  
17 EVALUATING AN UNLICENSED INDIVIDUAL PERFORMING A NURSING TASK, ACT, OR  
18 RESPONSIBILITY.

19 (2) (I) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS  
20 PARAGRAPH, A PERSON ACTING IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE PERSON'S OR THE  
21 EMPLOYER'S BOARD APPROVED PROTOCOLS IS NOT SUBJECT TO THE PENALTY  
22 PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

23 (II) A PERSON WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH BOARD APPROVED  
24 PROTOCOLS IS IN VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION AND, EXCEPT AS  
25 PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C)(2) OF THIS SECTION, IS SUBJECT TO A PENALTY  
26 UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

27 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
28 October 1, 1996.
