3	FOR the purpose of excluding domestic ferrets from the animals that the Secretary of
4	Health and Mental Hygiene may find to be dangerous to human health and safety;
5	requiring certain ferrets to be vaccinated against rabies; requiring a person that
6	owns or keeps a ferret to submit proof of vaccination with an application for county
7	registration or licensing; requiring a licensed veterinarian who vaccinates a ferret to
8	provide the owner with a certain vaccination certificate; requiring the quarantine of
9	certain animals that have been vaccinated against rabies that bite or expose a
10	human to rabies; limiting the authority of a public health veterinarian or local

- health officer to destroy an animal for rabies testing to animals clinically suspected 11

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19
- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 23 (a) The Secretary may prohibit the importation, selling, trading, purchasing,
- 24 bartering, breeding, raising, keeping, or possession of any animals found to be dangerous
- 25 to human health and safety.

- 28 (2) Domestic dogs;

2 1 (3) DOMESTIC FERRETS; 2 (4) Animals used for agricultural purposes; 3 [(4)] (5) Animals used for scientific purposes; [(5)] (6) Animals used for educational purposes; 5 [(6)] (7) Animals used for public exhibitions; or [(7)] (8) Any animal that the Secretary determines is not a threat to human 7 health and safety. 8 18-318. (a) Each person who owns or keeps a dog [or], cat [or both], OR FERRET that 10 is 4 months old or older shall have the dog [or], cat, OR FERRET vaccinated adequately 11 against rabies. 12 (b) (1) A county may not register or license a dog [or], cat, OR FERRET unless 13 the person who owns or keeps the dog [or], cat, OR FERRET submits, withthe 14 application for registration or license, proof that the dog [or], cat, OR FERRET has been 15 vaccinated adequately against rabies. 16 (2) The public health veterinarian shall determine the proof of vaccination 17 that is acceptable. 18 18-319. 19 (a) A licensed veterinarian who vaccinates a dog [or], cat, OR FERRET against 20 rabies: 21 (1) May select the vaccine to be used; 22 (2) Shall administer the vaccine in a manner that is consistent with the 23 recommendations of the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians: 24 (3) Shall issue to the owner of the dog [or], cat, OR FERRET a vaccination 25 certificate, on the form that the Department approves; and 26 (4) Shall keep a record of the vaccination for a period of 5 years. 5 (C) AN ANIMAL UNDER QUARANTINE SHALL BE QUARANTINED in a place, 6 which may include the residence of the owner, in the manner designated by the local 7 health officer or the public health veterinarian for a suitable period as determined by the 8 health officer or the public health veterinarian.			
9 [(b)] (D) (1) At any time during the quarantine period, the public health 10 veterinarian or local health officer may order the owner of a biting animal to have the 11 animal monitored for rabies by a licensed veterinarian.			
12 (2) The owner of the animal shall pay for the cost of any examination or 13 other associated cost.			
[(c)] (E) An animal under quarantine may not be moved from the placeof quarantine without the written permission of the local health officer or public health veterinarian.			
[(d)] (F) The public health veterinarian or local health officer mayorder the immediate and humane destruction of a biting animal THAT IS CLINICALLY SUSPECTED TO BE RABID for rabies testing if:

21 (2) A licensed veterinarian determines that a quarantined animal is 22 inhumanely suffering; or			
23 (3) The animal is considered wild and is not claimed by an owner within 24 24 hours.
