## 2 Handguns - Seizure and Forfeiture - Disposition of Forfeited Property

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a law enforcement agency that seizes certain handguns or
- 4 certain property relating to a handgun to destroy the forfeited property or sell the
- 5 forfeited property to another law enforcement agency for official use by the
- 6 purchasing agency or a licensed firearms dealer; and generally relating to the
- 7 seizure and forfeiture of handguns.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 20 **Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments**

- 21 36C.
- 22 (a) The following items of property shall be subject to seizure and forfeiture, and,
- 23 upon forfeiture, no property right shall exist in them:
- 24 (i) Any handgun being worn, carried, or transported in violation of § 36B of
- 25 this article.
- 26 (ii) All ammunition or other parts of or appurtenances to any such handgun
- 27 worn, carried, or transported by such person or found in the immediate vicinity of such
- 28 handgun.

	1 (d) (1) Whenever property is forfeited under this section, the law enforcement 2 agency seeking forfeiture of the property may:
	3 (i) Order the property retained for the official use of the law 4 enforcement agency; [or]
	(ii) [Make such other disposition of the property as the law 6 enforcement agency deems appropriate] DESTROY THE FORFEITED PROPERTY; OR
	(III) SELL THE FORFEITED PROPERTY TO:
	1. ANOTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY FOR OFFICIAL USE BY THE PURCHASING AGENCY; OR
1	0 2. A LICENSED FIREARMS DEALER.
	1 (2) Within 30 days of the disposition of the forfeited property, the law 2 enforcement agency shall notify the Secretary of the State Police of:
1	3 (i) The description of the property forfeited;
1	4 (ii) The type of disposition made;
	5 (iii) The identity of the person to whom the property was transferred 6 for disposal, retention, or resale; and
	7 (iv) If the person was a licensed firearms dealer, the firearms dealer's 8 license number and address.
	9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 0.0 October 1, 1996.
