A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Creation of a State Debt - Worcester County - Furnace Town/Nature Conservancy 3 Visitors Center

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$100,000, the

5 proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Furnace Town

- 6 Foundation, Inc. for certain acquisition, development, or improvement purposes;
- 7 providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the
- 8 grantee provide and expend a matching fund; and providing generally for the
- 9 issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 MARYLAND, That:

(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as theWorcester
County - Furnace Town/Nature Conservancy Visitors Center Loan of 1996 in a total
principal amount equal to the lesser of (i) \$100,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching
fund provided in accordance with Section 1(5) below. This loan shall beevidenced by the
issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of
the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordancewith §§ 8-117
through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the
Code.

(2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan maybe sold as a
single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under §
8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

(3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects'and engineers' fees: as a grant to the Board of Directors of the Furnace Town Foundation, Inc. (referred to hereafter in this Act as "the grantee") for the planning, design, and construction of, and for the provision of capital equipment for, an addition to a building, to be used as the Furnace Town/Nature Conservancy Visitors Center, located in the FurnaceTown Historic District, outside Snow Hill, in Worcester County.

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1 (4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in theState in rate 2 and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and when due 3 and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years after the date of 4 issuance of the bonds.

5 (5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the 6 purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a matching 7 fund. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or 8 indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of 9 the fund may consist of real property or funds expended prior to the effective date of this 10 Act. The fund may consist of in kind contributions. In case of any dispute as to the 11 amount of the matching fund or what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the 12 Board of Public Works shall determine the matter and the Board's decision is final. The 13 grantee has until June 1, 1998, to present evidence satisfactory to theBoard of Public 14 Works that a matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the 15 Board shall certify this fact and the amount of the matching fund to the State Treasurer, 16 and the proceeds of the loan equal to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended 17 for the purposes provided in this Act. Any amount of the loan in excessof the amount of 18 the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works shall be canceled and be of no 19 further effect.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 June 1, 1996.

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
