## 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 19 Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

- 21 (a) (1) (i) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 22 (ii) "GAMING DEVICE" DOES NOT INCLUDE A BINGO GAME, SLOT
- 23 MACHINE, OR OTHER GAME OR DEVICE THAT IS REGULATED BY STATE LAW.
- 24 (III) "Permit" means:
- 25 1. A multiple gaming device permit, allowing two or more of the
- 26 GAMING devices specified in paragraph [(3)] (6) of this subsection; or
- 27 2. A raffle permit issued under subsection (h) of this section.
- 28 [(iii)] (IV) 1. "Raffle" means a lottery using paper chances in which
- 29 prizes are won by persons who buy chances in the lottery.

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1	2. A raffle is not a multiple gaming device unless run in
2	conjunction with an event requiring a multiple gaming device permit.
3	(2) This section only applies in Kent County.
6 7 8	(3) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPHS (4) AND (5) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY OR AUXILIARY, A VETERANS' ORGANIZATION OR AUXILIARY, OR BONA FIDE RELIGIOUS, NONPROFIT, FRATERNAL, EDUCATIONAL, CIVIC, PATRIOTIC, OR CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION OR CORPORATION MAY HOLD A FUND-RAISING AFFAIR FOR THE EXCLUSIVE BENEFIT OF THE COMPANY, ORGANIZATION, OR CORPORATION.
10	(4) AN INDIVIDUAL OR GROUP OF INDIVIDUALS MAY NOT:
11 12	(I) BENEFIT FINANCIALLY FROM THE HOLDING OF THE FUND-RAISING AFFAIR; OR
13 14	(II) RECEIVE OR BE PAID ANY OF THE PROCEEDS FROM THE FUND-RAISING AFFAIR.
17	(5) IF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ESTABLISH A PERMIT SYSTEM FOR GAMING DEVICES OR RAFFLES, AN ENTITY LISTED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION MUST ACQUIRE THE APPROPRIATE PERMIT BEFORE USING GAMING DEVICES OR RAFFLES IN A FUND-RAISING AFFAIR.
21 22	[(3)] (6) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article, the County Commissioners may issue a multiple gaming device permit to any of the following organizations to conduct a fund-raising affair at which merchandise or cash prizes may be awarded by GAMING devices commonly known as paddle wheels, wheels of fortune, chance books, card games, raffles, or by any other gaming device:
	(i) A county or municipally supported volunteer fire company or auxiliary unit whose members are directly associated with the fire company or auxiliary unit;
27 28	(ii) A nationally chartered veterans' organization or auxiliary unit whose members are directly associated with the organization;
	(iii) A bona fide religious organization which has conducted religious services at the same location in Kent County for at least 3 years before applying for a permit;
	(iv) A bona fide nonprofit fraternal, educational, civic, patriotic, or charitable organization desiring to conduct a fund-raiser for the benefit of a charity located in Kent County; or
37	(v) A bona fide nonprofit organization desiring to raise money for an exclusively charitable, athletic, or educational purpose specifically described in the permit application, that has operated on a nonprofit basis in Kent County for at least 3 years before applying for a permit.

	[(4)] (7) An organization under paragraph [(3)] (6) of this subsection shall be organized in and serve the residents of Kent County to be eligible for a permit under this subsection.
6	[(5)] (8) The County Commissioners shall determine whether an organization qualifies for a permit under this subsection. An organization, institution, association, society, or corporation that is exempt from taxation under§ 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code is a bona fide charity, under this subsection.
	[(6)] (9) This section may not be construed to authorize the use of slot machines, or any other type of coin machine, for gambling purposes. Slot machines are regulated under § 264B of this article.
11	(b) The County Commissioners may:
12 13	(1) Adopt regulations concerning permit applications and the issuance of permits;
14	(2) Charge a fee set by resolution for each permit; AND
15 16	(3) [Regulate the number of permits which may be issued to organizations each year; and
17 18	(4)] Deny a permit to an organization for up to 3 years if it violates the provisions of this section or the regulations adopted under it.
19 20	(c) (1) [The County Commissioners may not issue more than two multiple gaming device permits in a year to an organization.
23	(2) (i)] Subject to [subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph,] PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, a multiple gaming device permit issued under this section for a fund-raiser at which two or more gaming devices will be used shall be valid for only one event lasting 6 hours.
	[(ii)] (2) The County Commissioners may waive the 6-hour limitation on the period for which a permit is valid if the organization does not seek more than one multiple gaming device permit a year.
30	(g) (1) Unless a waiver is granted by the County Commissioners OR UNLESS A PERMIT SYSTEM IS NOT ESTABLISHED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, a fund-raiser conducted under this section shall be managed and operated only by individuals domiciled in Kent County on behalf of the organization that receives a permit.
