A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Jennings Randolph Lake - Department of Natural Resources - Regulatory Authority

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Department of Natural Resources to adopt boating

- 4 regulations exclusively applicable to Jennings Randolph Lake; requiring that the
- 5 regulations be developed in coordination with the State of West Virginia and allow
- 6 for joint enforcement in accordance with the Jennings Randolph Lake Project
- 7 Compact; providing that the regulations may differ from certain Maryland laws that
- 8 would otherwise apply; specifying matters the regulations may address; and
- 9 generally relating to the Department of Natural Resources' regulatory authority and
- 10 implementation of the Jennings Randolph Lake Project Compact.

11 BY adding to

- 12 Article Natural Resources
- 13 Section 8-703.2
- 14 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 15 (1990 Replacement Volume and 1995 Supplement)
- 16 Preamble

17 WHEREAS, The legislatures of Maryland and West Virginia have both enacted the

- 18 Jennings Randolph Lake Project Compact, relating to the joint management of Jennings
- 19 Randolph Lake located in Garrett County, Maryland and Mineral County, West Virginia,
- 20 and ratification of the Compact is currently pending in Congress; and

21 WHEREAS, Under the Compact, each state is to have concurrent jurisdiction for 22 the purpose of enforcing the laws of the respective states pertaining to natural resources 23 and boating activities at the Lake; and

24 WHEREAS, Differences in the boating laws of the respective states would result in 25 an untenable situation for boaters on the Lake; and

- 26 WHEREAS, In order to effectively coordinate management and enforcement of
- 27 boating activities on the Lake in accordance with the intent of the Compact, it is
- 28 necessary that the Department of Natural Resources have flexibility in regulating boating
- 29 activities on the Lake in coordination with the State of West Virginia;now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 Article - Natural Resources

4 8-703.2.

5 (A) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE
6 DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT BOATING REGULATIONS EXCLUSIVELY APPLICABLE TO
7 JENNINGS RANDOLPH LAKE.

8 (B) REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION:

9 (1) SHALL BE DEVELOPED IN COORDINATION WITH THE STATE OF 10 WEST VIRGINIA;

(2) SHALL ALLOW FOR JOINT ENFORCEMENT OF BOATING ACTIVITIES
 BY MARYLAND AND WEST VIRGINIA AUTHORITIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
 JENNINGS RANDOLPH LAKE PROJECT COMPACT; AND

14 (3) MAY DIFFER FROM MARYLAND BOATING LAWS THAT WOULD 15 OTHERWISE APPLY.

16 (C) REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY:

17 (1) PROVIDE AGE LIMITS FOR THE OPERATION OF A VESSEL;

18 (2) ESTABLISH VESSEL NOISE LIMITS;

19 (3) IMPOSE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS REGARDING VESSELS;

20 (4) IMPOSE OTHER STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE 21 OPERATION OF A VESSEL;

22 (5) PROVIDE FOR RULES OF THE ROAD FOR VESSELS;

23 (6) PROVIDE REQUIREMENTS REGARDING THE OPERATION OF24 PERSONAL WATERCRAFT;

25 (7) IMPOSE RESTRICTIONS ON THE OPERATION OF VESSELS WHILE26 TOWING AN INDIVIDUAL ON WATER SKIS OR SIMILAR DEVICES; AND

27 (8) ADDRESS OTHER AREAS PERTAINING TO ACTIVITIES AT THE
28 JENNINGS RANDOLPH LAKE PROJECT THAT THE DEPARTMENT CONSIDERS
29 APPROPRIATE.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect31 July 1, 1996.

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
