CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 State Board of Dental Examiners - Dentist Rehabilitation Committee - Funding

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Dental Examiners to usecertain fees

- set, collected, and distributed to the State Board of Dental Examiners Fund to fund 4
- 5 the budget of a dentist rehabilitation committee under certain circumstances; and
- 6 defining a certain term.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- Article Health Occupations 8
- Section 4-207 and 4-501 9
- 10 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 11 (1994 Replacement Volume and 1995 Supplement)

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article - Health Occupations** 14

15 4-207.

16 (a) There is a State Board of Dental Examiners Fund.

17 (b) (1) The Board may set reasonable fees for the issuance and renewal of 18 licenses and its other services.

19 (2) The fees charged shall be set so as to approximate the costof 20 maintaining the Board.

21 (3) Funds to cover the compensation and expenses of the Board members 22 shall be generated by fees set under this section.

1 (c) (1) The Board shall pay all funds collected under this title to the 2 Comptroller of the State.

3 (2) The Comptroller shall distribute the fees to the State Board of Dental4 Examiners Fund.

5 (d) (1) The Fund shall be used to cover the actual documented directand
6 indirect costs of fulfilling the statutory and regulatory duties of theBoard as provided by
7 the provisions of this article.

8 (2) The Fund is a continuing nonlapsing fund, not subject to § 7-302 of the9 State Finance and Procurement Article.

(3) Any unspent portions of the Fund may not be transferred or revert tothe General Fund of the State, but shall remain in the fund to be used for the purposesspecified in this article.

13 (4) No other State money may be used to support the Fund.

(E) (1) IN ADDITION TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS
SECTION, THE BOARD SHALL FUND THE BUDGET OF A DENTIST REHABILITATION
COMMITTEE, AS DEFINED IN § 4-501 OF THIS TITLE, WITH FEES SET, COLLECTED, AND
DISTRIBUTED TO THE FUND UNDER THIS TITLE.

(2) AFTER REVIEW AND APPROVAL BY THE BOARD OF A BUDGET
 SUBMITTED BY A DENTIST REHABILITATION COMMITTEE, THE BOARD MAY
 ALLOCATE MONIES FROM THE FUND TO THE DENTIST REHABILITATION
 COMMITTEE.

22 [(e)] (F) (1) A designee of the Board shall administer the Fund.

(2) Moneys in the Fund may be expended only for any lawful purposeauthorized under the provisions of this article.

[(f)] (G) The Legislative Auditor shall audit the accounts and transactions of theFund as provided in § 2-1215 of the State Government Article.

28 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

- 29 (2) "Dental review committee" means a committee or board that:
- 30 (i) Is within one of the categories described in subsection (b) of this 31 section; and
- 32 (ii) Performs any of the functions listed in subsection (c) of this 33 section.

34 (3) "DENTAL REHABILITATION COMMITTEE" MEANS A DENTAL REVIEW
35 COMMITTEE THAT PERFORMS ANY OF THE FUNCTIONS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION
36 (C)(5) OF THIS SECTION.

37 [(3)] (4) "Provider of dental care" means any person who is licensed by law38 to provide dental care to individuals.

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1 (b) For purposes of this section, a dental review committee is:

2 (1) A regulatory board or agency established by State or federal law to3 license, certify, or discipline any provider of dental care;

4 (2) A committee of the Maryland State Dental Association, the Maryland
5 Dental Society or any of their component societies, or a committee of any other
6 professional society or association composed of providers of dental care;

7 (3) A committee of the medical staff or other committee of a hospital or 8 related institution, if the governing board of the hospital or related institution forms and 9 approves the committee or approves the written bylaws under which the committee 10 operates;

(4) Any person, including a professional standard review organization, who
contracts with an agency of this State or of the federal government to perform any of the
functions listed in subsection (c) of this section; or

14 (5) Any person who contracts with a provider of dental care to perform any15 of those functions listed in subsection (c) of this section that are limited to the review of16 services provided by the provider of dental care.

17 (c) For purposes of this section, a dental review committee:

18 (1) Evaluates and seeks to improve the quality of dental care provided by19 providers of dental care;

20 (2) Evaluates the need for and the level of performance of dental care 21 provided by providers of dental care;

(3) Evaluates the qualifications, competence, and performance of providersof dental care;

24 (4) Evaluates and acts on matters that relate to the disciplineof any25 provider of dental care; or

26 (5) Evaluates and provides assistance to any provider of dentalcare in need
27 of treatment and rehabilitation for alcoholism, drug abuse, chemical dependency, or
28 other physical, emotional, or mental condition.

(d) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the proceedings, records, and
files of a dental review committee are not discoverable and are not admissible in evidence
in any civil action arising out of matters that are being reviewed and evaluated by the
dental review committee.

33 (e) Subsection (d) of this section does not apply to:

(1) A civil action brought by a party to the proceedings of thedental reviewcommittee who claims to be aggrieved by the decision of the dental review committee; or

36 (2) Any record or document that is considered by the dental review
37 committee and that otherwise would be subject to discovery and introduction into
38 evidence in a civil trial.

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1 (f) A person who acts in good faith and within the scope of jurisdiction of a

2 dental review committee is not civilly liable for any action as a member of the dental

3 review committee or for giving information to, participating in, or contributing to the

4 function of the dental review committee.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 1996.
