- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 (a) The court may modify a child support award subsequent to the filing of a
- 18 motion for modification and upon a showing of a material change of circumstance.
- 19 (b) The court may not retroactively modify a child support award prior to the date 20 of the filing of the motion for modification.
- 21 (C) IF A MASTER PREPARES A WRITTEN RECOMMENDATION FOR A
- 22 MODIFICATION OF A CHILD SUPPORT AWARD THAT INCREASES THE AMOUNT OF
- 23 CHILD SUPPORT, AND EXCEPTIONS ARE FILED BY THE PARTY REQUIRED TO PAY
- 24 THE INCREASE, THE COURT SHALL, WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE FILING OF THE
- 25 EXCEPTIONS, EITHER:
- 26 (1) DIRECT THE ENTRY OF AN ORDER OR JUDGMENT; OR
- 27 (2) ENTER A TEMPORARY ORDER REQUIRING THAT THE AMOUNT BY
- 28 WHICH THE CHILD SUPPORT AWARD WAS INCREASED BE PAID INTO AN ESCROW
- 29 ACCOUNT ESTABLISHED BY THE COURT UNTIL THE COURT DIRECTS THE ENTRY OF

- 2 DISPOSITION OF THE ESCROW ACCOUNT.
- 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 4 October 1, 1996.
