- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Public Service Commission to allow telephone
- 4 companies to levy charges for certain directory assistance calls; setting certain

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 15 Article 78 - Public Service Commission Law

- 17 (a) The Commission shall have the power to determine just and reasonable rates
- 18 of public service companies, whether as maximum, minimum or maximum and minimum,
- 19 respectively. The rates so determined shall be fixed by order to be served upon each
- 20 public service company affected thereby. This subsection does not applyto small rural
- 21 electric cooperatives.
- 22 (b) (1) The Commission may [not] authorize telephone company chargesto be
- 23 levied for directory assistance calls [made by residential customers upon the first 6 calls
- 24 made to directory assistance from each residential service per monthly billing cycle] IF
- 25 THE COMMISSION FINDS, AFTER NOTICE AND HEARING, THAT SUCH CHARGES
