L2 6lr1752 **By: Charles County Delegation** Introduced and read first time: January 31, 1996 Assigned to: Commerce and Government Matters Committee Report: Favorable House action: Adopted Read second time: March 5, 1996 CHAPTER \_\_\_\_ 1 AN ACT concerning 2 Charles County - Sheriff's Office 3 FOR the purpose of adding specified positions to the office of Sheriff of Charles County; 4 requiring that a certain ordinance provide certain provisions and that certain 5 actions be taken in accordance with the ordinance; requiring that the Sheriff require each sworn member of the office to undertake certain duties; addressing pension 6 7 rights of employees of the Sheriff's office; eliminating a requirement that certain contraband be sold; providing that the County Commissioners are to make certain 8 9 budgetary decisions relating to the Sheriff's office; repealing certain provisions 10 relating to rules and regulations concerning Sheriff's office personnel; making this Act an emergency measure; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the 11 12 operation of the Sheriff's office in Charles County. 13 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 14 The Public Local Laws of Charles County 15 Section 125-4 Article 9 - Public Local Laws of Maryland 16 17 (1994 Edition and November 1995 Supplement, as amended) 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 20 **Article 9 - Charles County** 21 125-4.

A. The office of Sheriff of Charles County consists of:

7 8	B. The office of the Sheriff is located at La Plata. It shall use the facilities of the Courthouse at La Plata or other facilities as provided by the County Commissioners for the establishment of its office[, for the establishment of its office, and the]. THE Board of County Commissioners is authorized to construct, lease, or acquire any other facilities for the use of the Sheriff.		
12 13 14 15 16 17	C. (1) The Board of Public Safety is composed of five members[, all of whom are residents]. EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD SHALL BE A RESIDENT of Charles County for AT LEAST 2 years prior to their membership. Two of the members are County Commissioners appointed by the County Commissioners; the third member is appointed by the County Commissioners and may not be an elected official; and thefourth and fifth members are appointed by a majority of the representatives of Charles County to the Maryland General Assembly. Unless otherwise replaced by the County Commissioners, the members of the Board shall serve for 4 years, except that the members who also serve as County Commissioners shall serve from the time of the appointment until the following election for the County Commissioners.		
22 23 24 25 26	(2) The County Commissioners shall enact an ordinance which shall provide for those powers and duties of the Board of Public Safety. Before enacting the ordinance, the County Commissioners shall consult with and seek the advice of the Sheriff of Charles County and shall hold a public hearing on the proposed ordinance. At a minimum, the ordinance shall address those powers, if any, of the Board concerning the appointment and compensation of a Medical Examiner, employment of administrative personnel, application procedures, qualifications, and process for appointment of Deputy Sheriffs, and promotions.		
28	D. (1) (a) The Sheriff shall devote full time to the duties of office.		
29 30	(b) The Sheriff is entitled to compensation in accordance with $\S$ 2-309 of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article.		
33	(2) (a) The salaries of the Deputy Sheriffs, based on rank and length of service, shall correspond to the salary schedule of the Maryland State Police employees [as set forth in] DEVELOPED UNDER Article 88B, § 23, of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

In accordance with the provisions of the Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of 2 Rights under Article 27, §§ 727 through 734D of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the 3 Sheriff may[, in his discretion,] suspend without pay, remove, dismiss, demote or 4 discharge any member of [his ] THE SHERIFF'S office for any offense against law or good 5 morals, for neglect of duty, inefficiency, physical or mental disability or breach of 6 discipline. 7 G. (1) The County Commissioners [of Charles County are hereby authorized 8 and empowered to MAY provide [clerks] CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS, DISPATCHERS, 9 ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES AS THE COUNTY 10 COMMISSIONERS CONSIDER NECESSARY for the Sheriff of the [county, such clerks to] 11 COUNTY. The Sheriff or a person authorized by [him] THE SHERIFF: 26 27 (1) May destroy any contraband article or goods seized by or delivered to 28 the office after removing any money contained therein[.]; 29 (2) Shall sell at public auction all lost, abandoned, unclaimed, forfeited, or 30 [undistributed contraband or] stolen property remaining in the possession of the office 31 for a period of 6 months without a lawful claimant[.]; AND 32 (3) Shall pay over to the County Treasurer for the use of the county all 33 money removed from contraband, all proceeds of such sales and all lost, abandoned, 34 unclaimed, forfeited or stolen money remaining in the possession of hisoffice for a period 35 of 6 months without a lawful claimant. I. The County Commissioners [of Charles County] shall equip and arm the 36 37 office of Sheriff. The Commissioners [are hereby authorized, empowered and directed 38 to SHALL purchase equipment, including motor vehicles, motorcycles, with or without
- 37 office of Sheriff. - 2 the members of the Sheriff's office to whom the equipment may be issuedupon
- 3 separation, for any cause, from the office[, and the]. THE COUNTY Commissioners shall
- 4 provide for the maintenance and repair of motor vehicles and equipment and for the
- 5 operation of motor vehicles and equipment, including gasoline, oil, tires, batteries and
- 6 accessories for the same. Notwithstanding the above, any [and all] vehicles provided by
- 7 the County Commissioners to the office of the Sheriff shall be deemed for all purposes
- 8 the property of the Sheriff while so assigned and shall be registered and licensed in the
- 9 name of the office of the Sheriff until retired from service and transferred back to the
- 10 County Commissioners.
- J. The Sheriff shall carry and serve all legal papers issued by the courts. The
- 12 Sheriff is empowered to appoint special officers to serve legal papers. The [Board of
- 13 Public Safety, subject to the approval of the Board of County Commissioners[,] shall
- 14 determine the number of special officers [from time to time] THROUGH APPROVAL OF
- 15 A LINE ITEM IN THE BUDGET OF THE SHERIFF.
- 16 K. [(1)] The Board of County Commissioners shall provide a merit or classified
- 17 service system to which all of the members of the Sheriff's office, except the Sheriff, shall
- 18 be subject. THE MERIT OR CLASSIFIED SERVICE SYSTEM SHALL BE ESTABLISHEDAS
- 19 A PART OF THE ORDINANCE REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (C)(2) OF THIS SECTION.
- 20 [(2) The Board of County Commissioners shall adopt and promulgate and
- 21 from time to time may amend and modify rules and regulations concerningstandards and
- 22 qualifications for each position within the classified system, minimum and maximum
- 23 salary schedules, the employment examination and qualification of prospective members,
- 24 hours of employment, holidays, sick leave and vacation allowance, and the County
- 25 Commissioners shall make suitable provision for competitive examinations and for notice
- 26 of vacancies in the classified service.
- 27 (3) The rules and regulations also shall make provision for emergency
- 28 appointments for a period not to exceed 4 months when an emergency arises which does
- 29 not permit compliance with the usual and ordinary provisions of the classified service.
- 30 (4) Members of the classified service may be permanently separated
- 31 therefrom through resignation, rejection on probation or removal for cause. They may be
- 32 temporarily separated from the classified service through suspension pending charges or
- 33 leaves of absence granted at the request of the employee.
- 34 (5) An employee shall not be permanently removed from the classified
- 35 service other than through resignation or rejection on probation exceptin accordance
- 36 with the provisions of the Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights under Article 27, §§
- 37 727 through 734D of the Annotated Code of Maryland for cause upon written charges
- 38 and after an opportunity to be heard in his own defense.
- 39 L. The County Commissioners may include the members of the Sheriff'soffice in
- 40 the State Retirement and Pension System as provided under Title 31 of the State
- 41 Personnel and Pensions Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.]
- 42 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- 43 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has

- 1 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
- 2 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
- 3 enacted.
