# A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Judges' Retirement System - Employment by Public Institution of Higher Education

3 FOR the purpose of exempting a retiree of the Judges' Retirement Systemfrom

- 4 provisions of law requiring a retirement allowance to be reduced by certain amounts
- 5 of compensation or retirement benefits received as a result of subsequent
- 6 employment by a public institution of higher education.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 14 Article - State Personnel and Pensions

15 27-406.

16 (a) This section does not apply to a retiree who is:

17 (1) temporarily assigned to sit in a court of this State under the authority of18 Article IV, § 3A of the Maryland Constitution; OR

#### 19 (2) EMPLOYED BY A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION.

20 (b) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, a retiree may accept employment in 21 which all or part of the compensation for the employment comes from municipal, county, 22 or State funds, if the retiree immediately notifies the Board of Trustees of:

- 23 (1) the retiree's intention to accept the employment; and
- 24 (2) the compensation that the retiree will receive.

25 (c) (1) The Board of Trustees shall reduce a retiree's retirement allowance by

26 the amount that the sum of the retiree's annual retirement allowance and the retiree's

27 annual compensation exceeds the amount of the compensation on which theretirement

28 allowance is based.

## HOUSE BILL 616

(2) If a retiree accepts employment as allowed by subsection (a) of this
section and is subsequently awarded retirement benefits because of thatemployment, the
Board of Trustees shall reduce the retiree's benefits under this subtile by the amount of
the retirement benefits resulting from the subsequent employment.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 July 1, 1996.
