FOR the purpose of increasing the maximum manufacturer's rated capacityof a Class E (truck) vehicle that is eligible for special personalized registration plates, amateur radio operator's registration plates, commemorative registration plates, nonprofit organization registration plates, or registration plates for recipients of certain combat-related armed forces medals; and generally relating to the eligibility of trucks for certain registration plates.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Transportation

(a) (1) The owner of any vehicle described in paragraph (2) of this subsection 4 may apply to the Administration for the assignment to that vehicle of aspecial, personalized registration number.

(ii) A Class E (tuck) veicle with [3/4] 1 ton or less maufactur
(a) The Administration may issue special commemorative original or substitute registration plates for any geographical, historical, natural resource, or environmental commemoration of statewide significance.
(b) The owner of a vehicle, or a lessee of the vehicle under a leasenot intended as security, or a director, officer, employee, or partner of a business entity that owns the vehicle considered eligible by the Administration may apply to the Administration for the assignment of a commemorative registration plate under this section if the vehicle is included in one of the following classes:

(5) A Class M (multipurpose) vehicle.

2 (a) The owner of a motor vehicle, or a lessee of the vehicle under alease not 3 intended as security, or a director, officer, employee, or partner of abusiness entity that 4 owns the vehicle who is a member of an organization considered eligibleby the 5 Administration may apply to the Administration for the assignment of a special 6 registration number if the vehicle is included in one of the following classes:
(1) A Class A (passenger) vehicle;
(2) A Class E (truck) vehicle with a manufacturer's rated capacity of [3/4] 91 ton or less; or
(3) A Class M (multipurpose) vehicle.
(c) The Administration may issue and continue a special registrationnumber 2 under this section if:
(2) At least 25 owners of vehicles in a class apply to the Administration for 18 the assignment of special registration numbers, and at least 25 specialregistration 9 numbers are issued initially.

21 (a) (1) The owner of a motor vehicle, or a lessee of the vehicle under a lease not 22 intended as security, or a director, officer, employee, or partner of abusiness entity that 3 owns the vehicle may apply to the Administration for the assignment of a special 4 registration number and special registration plates under this section for a vehicle 5 included in one of the following classes:
(i) A Class A (passenger) vehicle;
(ii) A Class E (truck) vehicle with a [3/4] 1 ton or less manufacturer's
