16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 Article 78 - Public Service Commission Law

- 20 (a) The Commission shall have the power to determine just and reasonable rates
- 21 of public service companies, whether as maximum, minimum or maximum andminimum,
- 22 respectively. The rates so determined shall be fixed by order to be served upon each
- 23 public service company affected thereby. This subsection does not applyto small rural
- 24 electric cooperatives.
- 25 (c) (1) [The] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE
- 26 Commission may not authorize any mandatory telephone company charges based on a
- 27 measured time period unit rate for local messages.
- 28 (2) Paragraph (1) of this subsection does not preclude the Commission from
- 29 any study or evaluation of mandatory telephone company charges. IF, AFTER
- 30 EVALUATING MANDATORY TELEPHONE COMPANY CHARGES BASED ON A

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- 1 MEASURED TIME PERIOD UNIT RATE FOR LOCAL MESSAGES FOR NONRESIDENTIAL
- 2 CUSTOMERS, THE COMMISSION DETERMINES THAT MANDATORY CHARGES BASED
- 3 ON A MEASURED TIME PERIOD UNIT RATE ARE APPROPRIATE AND NECESSARY TO
- 4 ENSURE JUST AND REASONABLE RATES FOR NONRESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS, THE
- 5 COMMISSION MAY AUTHORIZE MANDATORY MEASURED TIME PERIOD UNIT RATES
- 6 FOR NONRESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS.
- 7 (3) If the Commission authorizes any telephone company to offerto
- 8 residential customers the option of telephone charges based on a measured time period
- 9 unit rate for local messages, the Commission shall also require the telephone company to
- 10 offer to residential customers:
- 11 (i) The option of an unlimited number and duration of local calls; and
- 12 (ii) The option of a specific charge per local call, regardless of the
- 13 duration of the local call.
- 14 (4) Until December 1, 1985 a telephone company may not require the
- 15 payment of an order processing charge or line change charge for a residential customer's
- 16 first change to any type of local telephone service based on charges per call or measured
- 17 time period unit rates.
- 18 (5) A telephone company may not require the payment of an order
- 19 processing charge or line change charge for a residential customer's first change from
- 20 local telephone service based on charges for measured time period unit rates, if the
- 21 change occurs within 18 months of the date that the consumer elects this telephone
- 22 service.
- 23 (6) The Public Service Commission may not authorize any telephone
- 24 company to charge for the distance of a call within any local calling area.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 26 October 1, 1996.
