BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 21

23 (a) A Class 6 pub-brewery license shall be issued:

23 24	(c) The pub brewery premises shall be located immediately adjacent to the restaurant where the brewed beverage is to be sold to the public.
25	(d) The Class 6 pub brewery license is void if:
26	(1) The restaurant ceases to be operated as a restaurant; or
27	(2) The holder's Class B beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) license is revoked
	or transferred to a different location.
29	(e) If the holder's Class B beer, wine and liquor (on sale) license is suspended,
	the Class 6 pub-brewery license shall be suspended for the same period of time.
31	(f) Except for a license transferred to a new location, a Class 6 pub brewery
	license may be transferred under § 10-503 of this article if an application for transfer is
33	filed with the local licensing board and simultaneously filed with the Office of the

1	(g) (1) In the City of Annapolis, Anne Arundel County, Baltimore City,
2	Baltimore County, and Charles County, the holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license may
3	sell malt beverages for off premises consumption in sealed refillable containers.
4	(2) The containers may be returned and at the time of refill shall be sealed
3	by the pub-brewery licensee.
6	(3) A holder of a Class 6 pub brewery license in the City of Annapolis,
	Anne Arundel County, Baltimore City, Baltimore County, or Charles County, may not sell
	malt beverages to any retail alcoholic beverages licensee in this Statefor the purpose of
9	a subsequent sale or distribution of that malt beverage under the retail license.
10	(h) In Montgomery County, within the City of Gaithersburg, a holder of a Class 6
	pub-brewery license shall enter into a written agreement with the Department of Liquor
	Control [for Montgomery County] for the sale and resale of all malt beverages brewed

15	(a) There is a Class 7 micro-brewery (on- and off-sale) license.
16	(b) The license shall be issued:
17	(1) By the State Comptroller;
18	(2) Only in the following jurisdictions:

22	(iv) The City of Annapolis;
23	(v) Anne Arundel County;

4 1 (c) (1) A holder of a Class 7 micro-brewery license: 2 (i) May brew and bottle malt beverages at a single location; and 3 (ii) May not brew more than 10,000 barrels of malt beverage each 4 calendar year. 5 (2) In Allegany County only, the holder of a Class 7 license: (i) May brew in one location and may contract for the bottling of the 6 7 malt beverage in another location; and (ii) Need not meet the hotel/motel requirements for a Class B beer, 9 wine and liquor licensee but shall meet the requirements for those Class B restaurants. 10 (3) IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY ONLY, THE HOLDER OF A CLASS 7 11 LICENSE MAY BREW IN MORE THAN ONE LOCATION IF THE HOLDER HAD A CLASS 6 12 LICENSE IN GAITHERSBURG PRIOR TO JANUARY 1, 1996 AND, SUBSEQUENTLY, 13 OBTAINED A CLASS 7 LICENSE. 14 (d) (1) The on-sale privilege authorizes the holder to sell at retail beer brewed 15 under this license to customers for consumption on the licensed premises. (2) The off-sale privilege authorizes the holder to sell and deliver beer 16 17 brewed under this license to: 18 (i) Any wholesaler licensed under this article to sell beer in this State; 19 or 20 (ii) Any person who is located in a state other than Maryland who is 21 authorized under the laws of that state to receive brewed beverages. 22 (3) In the City of Annapolis, Anne Arundel County, Baltimore City, 23 Baltimore County, Charles County, Howard County, and Prince George's County only, 24 the holder may sell at retail beer brewed under this license to customers for consumption 25 off the licensed premises in refillable containers that are sealed by the micro-brewery 26 licensee at the time of each refill. 27 (4) IN THE CITY OF GAITHERSBURG IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY ONLY, A 28 HOLDER OF A CLASS 7 MICRO-BREWERY LICENSE SHALL ENTER INTO A WRITTEN 29 AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF LIQUOR CONTROL FOR THE SALE AND 30 RESALE OF ALL MALT BEVERAGES BREWED UNDER THIS LICENSE IN ACCORDANCE 31 WITH THIS ARTICLE. 32 (e) A holder of a Class 7 micro-brewery license: 33 (1) May not own, operate or be affiliated with any other manufacturer of 34 beer; and (2) Notwithstanding § 2-201(b) of this article, may not be granted a 35

36 wholesale alcoholic beverages license.

- 1 (f) The hours and days for consumer sales under this license are as established
- 2 for a Class B license in the respective jurisdictions listed in subsection (b)(2) of this
- 3 section.
