## A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority - Employee Rights and Benefits PG/MC 18-96

4 FOR the purpose of altering certain provisions of law relating to the Washington

- 5 Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) to make these provisions
- 6 consistent with federal law; repealing certain provisions extending transfer and
- 7 appointment opportunities for employees of certain mass transit systems to be
- 8 employees of the WMATA under certain circumstances; extending benefits or
- 9 rights granted under certain provisions of federal law for employeeswhose positions
- 10 are adversely affected by the expenditure of certain federal funds; providing for a
- 11 certain contingency; and generally relating to employee rights in matters relating to
- 12 activities of the WMATA.

## 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 25 (a) The rights, benefits, and other employee protective conditions and remedies
- 26 of [§] SECTION 13(c) of the [Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964,] FEDERAL
- 27 TRANSIT ACT as amended [(49 U.S.C. 1609(c))] (49 U.S.C. § 5333(B)), asdetermined by
- 28 the Secretary of Labor, shall apply to [the operation by the WashingtonMetropolitan
- 29 Area Transit Authority of any mass transit facilities owned or controlled by it and to any
- 30 contract or other arrangement for the operation of transit facilities. Whenever the

Authority shall operate any transit facility or enter into any contractual or other
arrangements for the operation of such transit facility the Authority shall extend to
employees of affected mass transportation systems first opportunity fortransfer and
appointment as employees of the Authority in accordance with seniority, in any
nonsupervisory job in respect to such operations for which they can qualify after a
reasonable training period. Such employment shall not result in any worsening of the
employee's position in his former employment nor any loss of wages, hours, working
conditions, seniority, fringe benefits and rights and privileges pertaining thereto.]
WASHINGTON METROPOLITAN AREA TRANSIT AUTHORITY EMPLOYEES OTHERWISE
COVERED BY THE ACT. THE AUTHORITY SHALL EXTEND TO EMPLOYEES WHOSE
POSITIONS ARE ADVERSELY AFFECTED BY THE EXPENDITURE OF FEDERAL FUNDS
OBTAINED BY WMATA PURSUANT TO CONGRESSIONAL APPROPRIATIONS, THE
RIGHTS, BENEFITS, AND OTHER EMPLOYEE PROTECTIVE CONDITIONS AND
REMEDIES OF SECTION 13(C) OF THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ACT, AS AMENDED (49 U.S.C.
§ 5333(B)).

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act may not take 17 effect until similar Acts are passed by the District of Columbia and the Commonwealth of 18 Virginia; that the District of Columbia and the Commonwealth of Virginia are requested 19 to concur in this Act of the General Assembly by the passage of substantially similar Acts; 20 that the Department of Legislative Reference shall notify the appropriate officials of the 21 District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Virginia, and the United States Congress of 22 the passage of this Act; and that, upon the concurrence in this Act by the District of 23 Columbia, the Commonwealth of Virginia, and the United States, the Governor of the 24 State of Maryland shall issue a proclamation declaring this Act valid and effective and 25 shall forward a copy of the proclamation to the Director of the Department of Legislative 26 Reference.

27 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisions 28 of Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 1996.

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
