- 5 FOR the purpose of repealing the limitations on the jurisdiction of theMetro Transit
- 6 Police; authorizing certain Metro Transit Police to make arrests outside of transit
- 7 facilities but within the Transit Zone under certain circumstances; authorizing
- 8 Metro Transit Police to carry and use certain weapons under certain circumstances;
- 9 requiring certain notice and public hearing procedures for the adoption of certain
- 10 regulations; requiring certain jurisdictions to prosecute criminal violations of rules
- 11 or regulations of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority(WMATA)
- in a certain manner; providing for a certain contingency; and generally relating to
- the authority of the Metro Transit Police and rules and regulations of the WMATA.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 21 **Article Transportation**
- 22 10-204.
- 23 Title III
- 24 Article XVI
- 25 76.
- 26 (a) The Authority is authorized to establish and maintain a regular police force,
- 27 to be known as the [metro transit police] METRO TRANSIT POLICE, to provide
- 28 protection for its patrons, personnel, and [transit] TRANSIT facilities. The [metro
- 29 transit police] METRO TRANSIT POLICE shall have the powers and duties and shall be
- 30 subject to the limitations set forth in this section. It shall be composed of both uniformed
- 31 and plainclothes personnel and shall be charged with the duty of enforcing the laws of the

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- 1 [signatories] SIGNATORIES, and the laws, ordinances and regulations of the political
- 2 subdivisions thereof in the [transit zone] TRANSIT ZONE, and the rules and regulations
- 3 of the Authority. The jurisdiction of the [metro transit police] METRO TRANSIT POLICE
- 4 shall [be limited to] INCLUDE all the [transit] TRANSIT facilities (including bus stops)
- 5 owned, controlled or operated by the Authority, but this restriction shall not limit the
- 6 power of the [metro transit police] METRO TRANSIT POLICE to make arrests in the
- 7 [transit zone]TRANSIT ZONE for violations committed upon, to, or against such
- 8 [transit] TRANSIT facilities committed from within or outside such [transit] TRANSIT
- 9 facilities[,] while in hot or close pursuit, or to execute traffic citations and criminal
- 10 process in accordance with subsection (c) below. The members of the [metro transit
- 11 police] METRO TRANSIT POLICE shall have concurrent jurisdiction in the performance
- 12 of their duties with the duly constituted law enforcement agencies of the [signatories]
- 13 SIGNATORIES and of the political subdivisions thereof in which any [transit] TRANSIT
- 14 facility of the Authority is located or in which the Authority operatesany [transit]
- 15 TRANSIT service. ON-DUTY METRO TRANSIT POLICE OFFICERS ARE AUTHORIZED TO
- 16 MAKE ARRESTS OFF OF TRANSIT FACILITIES WITHIN THE TRANSIT ZONE WHEN
- 17 IMMEDIATE ACTION IS NECESSARY TO PROTECT THE HEALTH, SAFETY, WELFARE
- 18 OR PROPERTY OF AN INDIVIDUAL FROM ACTUAL OR THREATENED HARM OR FROM
- 19 AN UNLAWFUL ACT. Nothing contained in this section shall either relieveany
- 20 [signatory] SIGNATORY or political subdivision or agency thereof from its duty to
- 21 provide police, fire, and other public safety service and protection, or limit, restrict, or
- 22 interfere with the jurisdiction of or the performance of duties by the existing police, fire,
- 23 and other public safety agencies. For purposes of this section, "bus stop" means that area
- 24 within 150 feet of a [metrobus] METROBUS bus stop sign, excluding the interior of any
- 25 building not owned, controlled[,] or operated by the Washington Metropolitan Area
- 26 Transit Authority.
- 27 (b) [Except as otherwise provided in this section, a] A member of the [metro
- 28 transit police] METRO TRANSIT POLICE shall have the same powers, including the power
- 29 of arrest, and shall be subject to the same limitations, including regulatory limitations, in
- 30 the performance of his duties as a member of the duly constituted police force of the
- 31 political subdivision in which the [metro transit police] METRO TRANSITPOLICE
- 32 member is engaged in the performance of his duties. [However, a]A member of the
- 33 [metro transit police] METRO TRANSIT POLICE is authorized to carry and use only such
- 34 weapons, including handguns, as are issued [or otherwise approved] by the Authority[,
- 35 and only in the performance of his duties or while on the transit facilities owned,
- 36 controlled, or operated by the Authority in direct transit to and from a duty assignment].
- 37 A member of the [metro transit police] METRO TRANSIT POLICE is [authorized to carry
- 38 such weapons only while in direct transit to and from a duty assignmentand is] subject to
- 39 such additional limitations in the use of weapons as are imposed on theduly constituted
- 40 police force for the political subdivision in which he is engaged in the performance of his
- 41 duties.
- 42 (e) The Authority shall have the power to adopt rules and regulations for the safe,
- 43 convenient, and orderly use of the [transit] TRANSIT facilities OWNED, CONTROLLED,
- 44 OR OPERATED BY THE AUTHORITY, including the payment and the manner of the
- 45 payment of fares or charges therefor, the protection of the [transit] TRANSIT facilities,
- 46 the control of traffic and parking upon the [transit] TRANSIT facilities, and the safety
- 47 and protection of the riding public. In the event that any such rules and regulations

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- 1 contravene the laws, ordinances, RULES, or regulations [or police operational rules] of a
- 2 [signatory] SIGNATORY or any political subdivision thereof which are existing or
- 3 subsequently enacted, these laws, ordinances, RULES, or regulations of the [signatory]
- 4 SIGNATORY or the political subdivision shall apply and the conflicting rule or regulation,
- 5 or portion thereof, of the Authority shall be void within the jurisdiction of that
- 6 [signatory] SIGNATORY or political subdivision. In all other respects, the rules and
- 7 regulations of the Authority shall be uniform throughout the [transit zone] TRANSIT
- 8 ZONE. [The rules and regulations adopted by WMATA will be adopted by the board
- 9 following public hearings held in accordance with § 15 SUPRA and then shall be
- 10 published by the political subdivisions of the signatories in the same manner as their
- 11 respective local ordinances are published. Judges and clerks of the several courts having
- 12 jurisdiction in the signatories and their political subdivisions shall have the authority to
- 13 impose, collect, and enforce penalties for failure to pay fines for violation of such rules
- 14 and regulations in the same manner as fines are imposed, collected, andenforced in the
- 15 respective signatories or political subdivisions.] THE RULES OR REGULATIONS
- 16 ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE ADOPTED BY THE BOARD
- 17 FOLLOWING PUBLIC HEARINGS HELD IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 62(C) AND (D)
- 18 OF THIS COMPACT. THE FINAL REGULATION SHALL BE PUBLISHED IN A NEWSPAPER
- 19 OF GENERAL CIRCULATION WITHIN THE ZONE AT LEAST 15 DAYS BEFORE ITS
- 20 EFFECTIVE DATE. Any person violating any rule or regulation of the Authority shall be
- 21 subject to arrest and, upon conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction, shall pay a fine
- 22 of not more than TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$250) and costs [and, upon further
- 23 order of the court, shall reimburse WMATA for any loss or damage resulting from the
- 24 violation]. CRIMINAL VIOLATIONS OF ANY RULE OR REGULATION OF THE
- 25 AUTHORITY SHALL BE PROSECUTED BY THE SIGNATORY OR POLITICAL
- 26 SUBDIVISION IN WHICH THE VIOLATION OCCURRED, IN THE SAME MANNER BY
- 27 WHICH VIOLATIONS OF LAW, ORDINANCES, RULES, AND REGULATIONS OF THE
- 28 SIGNATORY OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS ARE PROSECUTED.
- 29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act may not take
- 30 effect until similar Acts are passed by the District of Columbia and the Commonwealth of
- 31 Virginia; that the District of Columbia and the Commonwealth of Virginia are requested
- 32 to concur in this Act of the General Assembly by the passage of substantially similar Acts;
- 33 that the Department of Legislative Reference shall notify the appropriate officials of the
- 34 District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Virginia, and the United States Congress of
- 35 the passage of this Act; and that, upon the concurrence in this Act by the District of
- 36 Columbia, the Commonwealth of Virginia, and the United States, the Governor of the
- 37 State of Maryland shall issue a proclamation declaring this Act valid and effective and
- 38 shall forward a copy of the proclamation to the Director of the Department of Legislative
- 39 Reference.
- 40 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisions
- 41 of Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 1996.
