- 19 (B-1) (1) IN PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE
- 20 SUBDIVISION OF LAND SHALL REQUIRE THAT, IF THE SUBDIVIDER OR DEVELOPER
- 21 OWNS OR HAS ANY INTEREST IN ADJACENT OR NEIGHBORING LAND THAT THE
- 22 SUBDIVIDER OR DEVELOPER INTENDS TO SUBDIVIDE, NOTICE SHALL BE GIVEN TO
- 23 A POTENTIAL BUYER OF ANY LOT OR NEW DWELLING UNIT WITHIN THE
- 24 SUBDIVISION.
- 25 (2) THE NOTICE REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL:
- 26 (I) BE PROVIDED IN WRITING, BEFORE A SALES CONTRACT IS
- 27 SIGNED BY THE POTENTIAL BUYER; AND
- 28 (II) DETAIL ANY ANTICIPATED CHANGES TO THE EXISTING
- 29 ENVIRONMENT AS A RESULT OF THE SUBSEQUENT SUBDIVISION THAT REASONABLY

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- 1 MAY BE EXPECTED TO IMPACT THE USE AND ENJOYMENT OF A LOT OR DWELLING
- 2 UNIT IN THE INITIAL SUBDIVISION.
- 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 4 October 1, 1996.
