5 FOR the purpose of establishing the position of compliance officer for minority business
6 contracts within the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission to carry out the
7 requirements of the WSSC's minority business enterprise programs.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article 29 - Washington Suburban Sanitary District**

16 11-101.

17 (a) The WSSC shall organize its staff in a manner that promotes the efficient
18 disposition of all matters within the WSSC's jurisdiction.

19 (b) To carry out the provisions of this article, the WSSC may:

20 (1) Organize its staff into departments or other divisional organizations;

21 (2) Appoint and prescribe the functions, duties, and responsibilities of a
22 general manager, secretary, treasurer, chief engineer, and general counsel and other staff
23 as the WSSC considers necessary; and

24 (3) Appoint, discharge, and fix the compensation of all of its employees by
25 observing the requirements of this title.

26 (C) THE WSSC SHALL APPOINT A COMPLIANCE OFFICER FOR MINORITY
27 BUSINESS CONTRACTS TO CARRY OUT THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE MINORITY
28 BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED UNDER §§ 3-102(D) AND 3-109(C) OF
29 THIS ARTICLE.

1 [(c)] (D) This title does not prohibit the WSSC from employing consulting or
2 other outside engineering services that the WSSC considers necessary.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
4 October 1, 1996.
