- 4 FOR the purpose of altering certain restrictions concerning the construction of
- 5 composting facilities by the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission(WSSC);
- 6 providing that certain restrictions apply to all WSSC composting facilities without
- 7 regard to the date of construction; repealing a certain obsolete provision; and
- 8 generally relating to WSSC composting facilities.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article 29 - Washington Suburban Sanitary District

- 18 (a) Unless the WSSC takes precautions to make a composting facility free of
- 19 offensive off-site odors, the WSSC may not construct the facility in any area that has
- 20 more than 100 homes that are located within [5] 3 miles of the facility.
- 21 (b) The WSSC shall adopt regulations that provide standards for the construction
- 22 and operation of a composting facility that is free of offensive off-site odors.
- 23 (c) If the WSSC does not control and eliminate any offensive off-site odor that is
- 24 caused by a composting facility[that is constructed after July 1, 1986], THEN the WSSC
- 25 must close the facility within 4 months from the date the offensive off-site odor is emitted
- 26 from the facility.
- 27 (d) [On or before January 1, 1987, the WSSC shall take all necessaryand
- 28 reasonable actions to make any composting facility in existence on July1, 1986 free of
- 29 offensive off-site odors.

- 1 (e)] If a composting facility is closed for failure to meet any standards adopted by
- 2 the WSSC under this section, the Montgomery County government shall select an
- 3 alternative method or location for the disposition of sludge located atthe closed facility.
- 4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 July 1, 1996.
