BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 18 **Article - Transportation**

(a) "Travel trailer" means a vehicle that:

(1) Is mounted on wheels;

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1 2	(2) Is of such a size and weight as not to require any special highway movement permit when towed by a motor vehicle:
3	(3) Is designed and constructed primarily to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use; and
5	(4) Is no longer than 40 feet.
6	(b) "Travel trailer" includes a fifth wheel travel trailer.

8	(j) Except as otherwise provided in this section:
9 10	(1) In a combination of vehicles with a power unit that is a cargo-carrying vehicle, the overall length of the combination may not exceed 55 feet;
11	(2) Any other combination of vehicles may not exceed 55 feet; and
	(3) (i) 1. A truck or truck tractor and semitrailer combination designed for and engaged exclusively in the transportation of automobiles or boats may not exceed 65 feet in length;
15 16	2. A stinger steered automobile transporter or a saddle mount or a full mount combination may not exceed 75 feet in length; [and]
17 18	3. A COMBINATION OF VEHICLES CONSISTING OF A POWER UNIT AND A TRAVEL TRAILER MAY NOT EXCEED 65 FEET IN LENGTH; AND
19 20	[3.] 4. A. A maxi-cube vehicle described in subsection (a)(4)(i) of this section may not exceed 65 feet in length; and
21 22	B. A maxi-cube vehicle described in subsection (a)(4)(ii) of this section may not exceed 60 feet in length;
23 24	(ii) No other length requirements may be applied to the combinations of vehicles described in item (i) of this paragraph; and
27 28	(iii) The combinations of vehicles described in item (i) of this paragraph may only be operated on any part of the interstate system or other State system highways that are designated by the Secretary in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Transportation, or on a highway that is the shortest practical route between a designated highway and:
30	1. A truck terminal;
31	2. A point of origin/destination for cargo; or
32 33	3. For a distance not to exceed 1 mile, facilities for food, fuel, repairs, or rest.
