16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

33 (a) Each dealer shall make a written record, on a form p 34 of each business transaction that involves the acquisition of a se 35 object when the transaction is made.		

1	(b) Each pawnbroker shall make a written record, on a form provided by the Secretary, of each business transaction that involves:

	1 (c) Each pawnbroker shall make a written record, on a form provided by the 2 Secretary, of each transaction that involves the acquisition of an itemdescribed in 3 subsection (b)(3) of this section for the purpose of resale.		
	(d) A separate record entry shall be made for each item involved in a transaction. However, items in a matching set may be recorded as a set if acquired in a single transaction.		
	(e) The dealer shall tag each item individually with a number that corresponds to the transaction under which it was acquired. However, items acquired in a matching set may be tagged as a set.		
30 31	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1996.
