3 **(23rd District - Sunday Sales)**
4 **PG 323-96**

5 FOR the purpose of permitting Sunday sales of alcoholic beverages in the 23rd alcoholic
6 beverages district of Prince George's County; defining the 23rd alcoholic beverages
7 district; clarifying language and structure; and generally relating to alcoholic
8 beverages in Prince George's County.

9 BY adding to

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

2 9-217.

3 (1) (3) (I) THE 23RD ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DISTRICT SHALL AT ALL
4 TIMES BE COTERMINOUS WITH THE 23RD LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT OF PRINCE
5 GEORGE'S COUNTY, AS DETERMINED BY THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY BOARD OF
6 SUPERVISORS OF ELECTIONS. AS OF APRIL 7, 1994, THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES
7 DISTRICT CONSISTED OF:

8 1. PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY ELECTION DISTRICT 14;

9 2. PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY ELECTION DISTRICT 3,
10 PRECINCT 2;

11 3. PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY ELECTION DISTRICT 7,
12 PRECINCTS 1 THROUGH 8;

13 4. PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY ELECTION DISTRICT 20,
14 PRECINCTS 5 AND 9;

15 5. PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY ELECTION DISTRICT 21,
16 PRECINCTS 3, 6, 8, 11, 13, AND 16;

17 6. THAT PART OF PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY ELECTION
18 DISTRICT 7, PRECINCT 9 THAT CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING CENSUS TRACTS AND
19 BLOCKS:

20 A. CENSUS TRACT 8005.08, BLOCK 210;

21 B. CENSUS TRACT 8005.09, BLOCKS 201 THROUGH 210 AND 213
22 THROUGH 235; AND

23 C. CENSUS TRACT 8035.05, BLOCKS 103 AND 105;

24 7. THAT PART OF PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY ELECTION
25 DISTRICT 10, PRECINCT 10 THAT CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING CENSUS TRACTS AND
26 BLOCKS:

27 A. CENSUS TRACT 8002.06, BLOCKS 101A, 101B, 101C, 102, 103,
28 105, 108, 109, AND 111; AND

29 B. CENSUS TRACT 8004.06, BLOCKS 201 AND 215; AND

30 8. THAT PART OF PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY ELECTION
31 DISTRICT 21, PRECINCT 9 THAT CONSISTS OF CENSUS TRACT 8067.07, BLOCKS 101, 103A,
32 106, AND 107.

33 (II) SUNDAY SALES IN THE 23RD ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DISTRICT
34 ARE GOVERNED BY THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 11, SUBTITLE 3 OF THIS ARTICLE.

1 11-301.

2 (a) (1) The hours during which the privileges conferred by a Class Abeer
3 license may be exercised shall be from 6 o'clock a.m. to 12 o'clock midnight, on every day
4 except Sunday.

5 (2) In Montgomery County the hours shall be as provided in § 11-516(d)(1).

6 (3) (I) In Prince George's County the hours shall be from 6 o'clock a.m. to
7 2 o'clock a.m. on the day following, except on Sunday when no sales shall be permitted
8 after 2 o'clock a.m.

9 (II) IN THE 23RD ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DISTRICT, AS SET FORTH
10 IN § 9-217(L) OF THIS ARTICLE, SUNDAY SALES ARE PERMITTED.

11 (4) In Frederick County, on Sunday the hours of operation may be from 1
12 o'clock p.m. to 12 midnight.

13 (5) In Washington County, the hours of sale are as provided under § 11-522
14 of this article.

15 11-302.

16 (a) (1) The hours during which the privileges conferred by a Class Abeer and
17 light wine license may be exercised shall be from 6 o'clock a.m. to 12 o'clock midnight, on
18 every day except Sunday.

19 (2) In Montgomery County the hours shall be as provided in § 11-516(d)(1).

20 (3) (I) In Prince George's County the hours shall be from 6 o'clock a.m. to
21 2 o'clock a.m. on the day following except on Sunday when no sales shall be permitted
22 after 2 o'clock a.m.

23 (II) IN THE 23RD ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DISTRICT, AS SET FORTH
24 IN § 9-217(L) OF THIS ARTICLE, SUNDAY SALES ARE PERMITTED.

25 (4) In Frederick County, on Sunday the hours of operation may be from 1
26 p.m. to 12 midnight.

27 11-517.

28 (a) This section applies only in Prince George's County.

29 (b) (1) A holder of any retail alcoholic beverage license or any agent, servant or
30 employee of a holder of any alcoholic beverage license may not sell or serve any alcoholic
31 beverages or permit any alcoholic beverages to be consumed on the licensed premises
32 between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., except as provided in subsection (c) of this
33 section.

34 (2) A holder of any retail alcoholic beverage license or any agent, servant or
35 employee of a holder of any alcoholic beverages license may not sell any alcoholic
36 beverage or permit any alcoholic beverage to be consumed on the licensed premises
37 between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., except as provided in subsection (c) of this
38 section.

1 (3) Holders of any "on-sale" retail alcoholic beverage license, their agents,
2 servants, or employees may sell beer and light wine on Sunday, except between the hours
3 of 2:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m.

4 (4) A holder of any Class B restaurant license, with or without a Sunday
5 permit, may sell beer, wine and liquor on Sunday when it falls on Christmas Eve or New
6 Year's Eve, except between the hours of 2 a.m. and 8 a.m.

7 (5) (I) A holder of a Class A beer, wine and liquor license or any agent,
8 servant or employee of a holder of a Class A beer, wine and liquor license may not make
9 any sale between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. or on Sunday after 2:00 a.m. except
10 when December 24 and 31 fall on a Sunday.

11 (II) IN THE 23RD ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DISTRICT, AS DEFINED
12 IN § 9-217 OF THIS ARTICLE, CLASS A BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSEES MAY SELL
13 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON SUNDAYS DURING THE HOURS SET BY THE BOARD OF
14 LICENSE COMMISSIONERS.

15 (c) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article, if a Class B on-sale
16 licensee has live entertainment within the licensed premises on Friday, or Saturday
17 nights, the licensee may sell or serve alcoholic beverages, in accordance with his license,
18 between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 3:00 a.m. of the following day.

19 (d) (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 11-304 of this article, between the
20 hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on any day, a person may not consume any alcoholic
21 beverages on any premises open to the general public, any place of public entertainment,
22 any premises occupied regularly by a private club or organization, or any place at which
23 setups or other component parts of mixed alcoholic drinks are sold directly or indirectly,
24 except as provided in subsection (c) of this section.

25 (2) (i) Any person found consuming any alcoholic beverage within these
26 premises or in any place during the hours specified is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon
27 conviction fined not more than \$50 and not less than \$5.

28 (ii) The owner, operator, manager, waiter, server or employee of any
29 of these premises or places may not knowingly permit this consumption on those premises
30 or in that place during the hours specified. Any owner, operator, manager, waiter, server
31 or employee of any of these premises or places who knowingly permits this consumption
32 during the hours specified is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction is subject to the
33 penalties provided in § 16-503 of this article.

34 (e) (1) The holder of a Class A (off-sale) license who offers for sale in his
35 licensed premises commodities other than alcoholic beverages and is open on Sundays for
36 the sale of such commodities shall keep all alcoholic beverages upon the premises in a
37 separate beverage department securely closed and locked in a compartment,
38 compartments or enclosure between the hours of 2:00 a.m. on Sunday and 6:00 a.m. the
39 following Monday, subject to regulations of the Board of License Commissioners not
40 inconsistent with the provisions hereof. The provisions of this subsection do not apply to
41 alcoholic beverages in storage areas which are not open to the public.

42 (2) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBSECTION DO NOT APPLY IN THE 23RD
43 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DISTRICT, AS DEFINED IN § 9-217 OF THIS ARTICLE, TO THE

1 EXTENT THAT A CLASS A LICENSEE MAY SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON SUNDAY,
2 AS PERMITTED BY THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS.

3 (f) (1) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article, but in addition
4 thereto the holder of a beer, wine and liquor license, Class B, his agents, servants or
5 employees may not sell any alcoholic beverages for consumption off the licensed premises
6 between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. or on Sunday after 2:00 a.m. from any
7 separate store established on the licensed premises as an "off-sale store" or to keep an
8 "off-sale store" open for business on Sunday after 2 a.m. except that beer and light wine
9 only may be sold from an "off-sale" store which is attached to and a part of the licensed
10 premises on Sunday after eight a.m. until two a.m. the day following.

11 (2) IN THE 23RD ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES DISTRICT, AS DEFINED IN §
12 9-217 OF THIS ARTICLE, LIQUOR MAY BE SOLD ON SUNDAY DURING THE HOURS
13 SPECIFIED BY THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS FROM AN "OFF-SALE"
14 STORE.

15 (3) For the purpose of this provision, the Board of License Commissioners
16 shall determine by reasonable standards what shall constitute an "off-sale store".

17 (4) Nothing further herein shall be construed to permit sales at any time
18 between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. of any day.

19 (g) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article, the holder of:

20 (1) A special Class C (concession) license pursuant to § 6-301(r)(7) may sell
21 alcoholic beverages on Sundays between the hours of 12 noon and 2 a.m. the following
22 day;

23 (2) A special Class C (fraternal/sororal) license pursuant to §6-301(r)(3)
24 may not sell, serve, or permit alcoholic beverages to be consumed on the licensed
25 premises on Sundays before 12 noon or after 2 a.m. the following day; or

26 (3) A special Class C (yacht) license pursuant to § 6-301(r)(4) may not sell,
27 serve, or permit alcoholic beverages to be consumed on the licensed premises on Sunday
28 before 12 noon or after 12 midnight.

29 (h) (1) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article, the holder of a
30 wholesale license may enter into an agreement with the holder of a special 1 day license
31 issued pursuant to § 7-101 of this article to deliver beer on the effective day of the license
32 and accept returns on the same day of delivery.

33 (2) The parties shall agree upon the type of equipment, services, personnel,
34 and supplies that shall be required for the dispensing of draft beer.

35 (i) (1) In the 24th alcoholic beverages district of Prince George's County as
36 described in § 9-217(l) of this article, notwithstanding any other provision of this article,
37 the Board of License Commissioners may change the closing hour and reduce the hours
38 of sale of any licensee, under any class of alcoholic beverages license:

39 (i) On receipt of a bona fide complaint concerning the licensed
40 premises; and

1 (ii) After a hearing on the complaint.

2 (2) A decision of the Board of License Commissioners made under this
3 subsection may be appealed as provided under § 16-101 of this article.

4 (j) (1) In the 25th alcoholic beverages district of Prince George's County as
5 described in § 9-217(1) of this article, notwithstanding any other provision of this article,
6 the Board of License Commissioners may change the closing hour and reduce the hours
7 of sale of any licensee, under any class of alcoholic beverages license:

8 (i) On receipt of a bona fide complaint concerning the licensed
9 premises; and

10 (ii) After a hearing on the complaint.

11 (2) A decision of the Board of License Commissioners made under this
12 subsection may be appealed as provided under § 16-101 of this article.

13 (k) (1) This subsection applies only to Class B-DH (drafthouse) licenses.

14 (2) On Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, the hours for sale are from 5 p.m.
15 until 1:30 a.m. the following day.

16 (3) If a family matinee continues beyond 5 p.m., alcoholic beverages may not
17 be served until 15 minutes following the end of the matinee.

18 (4) Except for holidays which are governed by paragraph (2) of this
19 subsection, on weekdays the hours for sale are from 11 a.m. until 1:30 a.m. the following
20 day.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
22 October 1, 1996.
