A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Education - Obtaining a High School Diploma by Examination

- 3 FOR the purpose of expanding provisions relating to the exemption of students in a
- 4 certain alternative education school from certain requirements relating to obtaining
- 5 a high school diploma by examination; extending the time for the State Department
- 6 of Education to submit a certain report; extending the termination date of certain
- 7 provisions of law; and generally relating to the requirements for obtaining a high
- 8 school diploma by examination.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 **Article Education**
- 20 7-205.
- 21 (a) An individual may obtain a high school diploma by examination asprovided in
- 22 this section if the individual:
- 23 (1) Has not obtained a high school certificate or diploma;
- 24 (2) Has resided in this State or on a federal reservation in this State for at
- 25 least 3 months, except that the State Board may waive this residence requirement if the
- 26 State Board considers the waiver justified;
- 27 (3) Is 16 years old or older; and
- 28 (4) Has withdrawn from a regular full-time public or private school program
- 29 for at least 3 months, except that the State Board may waive the 3-month withdrawal

- 1 requirement for a student enrolled in [the Paquin School in Baltimore City] AN
- 2 APPROVED ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION SCHOOL if the State Board considers the waiver
- 3 justified.
- 4 (b) The State Board shall examine individuals for a high school diploma at least
- 5 twice each year at places throughout this State that are reasonably convenient for the
- 6 applicants.
- 7 (c) The examination shall:
- 8 (1) Be offered in appropriate high school subject areas; and
- 9 (2) Be of a comprehensive nature as determined by the State Board.
- 10 (d) An individual who fails an examination may take retests.
- 11 (e) A member of the armed forces may earn the Maryland high school diploma by
- 12 taking the examinations furnished by the United States Armed Forces Institute and given
- 13 by the appropriate service officer.
- 14 (f) The diploma shall be awarded in accordance with the rules and regulations
- 15 adopted by the State Board.

- 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Department of
- 18 Education shall, subject to § 2-1312 of the State Government Article, submit to the
- 19 General Assembly a report on the effect of exempting a [Paquin School] student
- 20 ENROLLED IN AN ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM from the 3-month withdrawal
- 21 requirement on or before January 1, [1998] 1999. The report shall include the number of
- 22 students granted the exemption and the number of students passing the test.
- 23 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 24 July 1, 1995. It shall remain effective for a period of [3] 4 years, and at the end of June
- 25 30, [1998] 1999, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall
- 26 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
- 27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 28 October 1, 1996.
