## 14 Article - State Finance and Procurement

13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 17-214.

- Each contractor and subcontractor under a public work contract shallpay not less 17 than the prevailing wage rate of:
- 18 (1) straight time to an employee who works 8 hours or less in a single
- 19 calendar day except a Sunday or legal holiday; and
- 20 (2) overtime to an employee for each hour the employee works:
- 21 (i) in excess of [8 hours in any single calendar day] 40 HOURS
- 22 DURING 1 WORKWEEK; and
- 23 (ii) on a Sunday or legal holiday.
- 24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That nothing in this Act may
- 25 be construed to affect a collective bargaining agreement that is signedbefore October 1,
