A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Lottery - Receipts and Cash Prizes

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the State Lottery Agency from requiring that State

- 4 Lottery sales agents send to the Agency receipts from the sale of tickets or shares
- 5 before a certain date; authorizing State Lottery sales agents to payin cash on-line
- 6 game prizes up to a certain limit; and generally relating to prizes and receipts of the
- 7 State Lottery Agency.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 Article - State Government

16 9-119.

17 (a) (1) Except for the commission of a licensed agent AND SUBJECT TO
18 PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, all of the receipts from the sale of State lottery
19 tickets or shares are due to the Agency:

20 [(1)] (I) on the due date that the Agency sets; or

21 [(2)] (II) at the times and within the intervals prescribed by agency

22 regulations.

23 (2) RECEIPTS FROM THE SALE OF STATE LOTTERY TICKETS OR SHARE S24 MAY NOT BE DUE TO THE AGENCY BEFORE 9 DAYS FOLLOWING THE DATE OF SALE.

26 (a) The regulations of the Agency shall provide for winning tickets to be drawn at 27 least once a week.

1 (b) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, § 10-113.1 of the Family 2 Law Article, and Article 27, § 640B of the Code a prize won under this subtitle is not 3 assignable. 4 (2) If the prize winner dies before the prize is paid, the prize may be paid to 5 the estate of the prize winner. (3) Under appropriate court order, a prize won under this subtitle may be 6 7 paid to a person other than the winner. (c) A LICENSED AGENT MAY PAY IN CASH GAME PRIZES OF NOT MORE THAN 8 9 \$5,000. 10 (D) (1) In this subsection, the words "bank" and "guardian" and references to a 11 "member" of a "minor's family" have the meanings stated in § 13-301 of the Estates and 12 Trusts Article. (2) If a minor wins a prize of less than \$5,000, the Director may give a draft, 13 14 AS PROVIDED FOR IN RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LOTTERY COMMISSION 15 payable to the order of the minor, to: 16 (i) an adult member of the minor's family; or (ii) a guardian of the minor. 17 18 (3) If a minor wins \$5,000 or more, the Director may deposit the prize in a 19 bank to the credit of 1 of the following, as custodian for the minor: (i) an adult member of the minor's family; or 20 21 (ii) a guardian of the minor. 22 (4) A custodian under paragraph (3) of this subsection has the same powers 23 and duties as a custodian under the Maryland Uniform Transfers to Minors Act.

[(d)] (E) On payment of a prize in accordance with this section, theDirector is discharged of all liability.

26 [(e)] (F) (1) A prize winner shall claim a prize within 182 days after the drawing 27 in which the prize is won.

(2) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, theDirector shallkeep an unclaimed prize:

30 (i) for 182 days after the drawing in which the prize is won, for31 payment of the winner; and

32 (ii) then in an unclaimed prize fund for use for other prizes.

(3) For a game that the Agency designates as a bonus game or drawing and
that is not a daily or weekly State lottery drawing, the period for claiming a prize may
differ from the period set in paragraph (2) of this subsection.
