## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

## 2

FOR the purpose of repealing the authority of the Governor to appoint certain members of the Baltimore County Board of Education; altering the number of members of the Board; providing for the election of the members of the Board, except for the student member; specifying the terms of the members initially elected to the Baltimore County Board of Education; specifying that certain incumbent members shall continue to serve until the elected members take office; terminating the terms of the incumbent appointed members; providing for the effective dateof this Act; and generally relating to the election of the members of the Baltimore County Board of Education.

SUBTITLE 2A. BALTIMORE COUNTY.
(A) THE BALTIMORE COUNTY BOARD CONSISTS OF 12 MEMBERS AS FOLLOWS:
(1) FOUR ELECTED FROM THE ENTIRE COUNTY AT LARGE;
(2) ONE ELECTED FROM EACH OF THE SEVEN COUNCILMANIC
(2) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD ON DECEMBER 1, 1998.
(3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS ELECTED AND QUALIFIES.
(4) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A QUALIFIED INDIVIDUAL TO FILL ANY VACANCY ON THE COUNTY BOARD FOR THE REMAINDER OF THAT TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS ELECTED AND QUALIFIES.
(5) (I) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH AND UNLESS OTHERWISE DISQUALIFIED UNDER THIS SECTION, A MEMBER OF THE COUNTY BOARD IS ELIGIBLE FOR REELECTION.
(II) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT SERVE FOR MORE THAN 2

CONSECUTIVE TERMS.
(C) (1) WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR, THE STATE
(I) IMMORALITY;
(II) MISCONDUCT IN OFFICE;
(III) INCOMPETENCY;
(IV) WILLFUL NEGLECT OF DUTY; OR
(V) FAILURE TO ATTEND, WITHOUT GOOD CAUSE, AT LEAST HALF OF THE SCHEDULED MEETINGS OF THE BOARD IN ANY 1 CALENDAR YEAR.
(2) BEFORE REMOVING A MEMBER, THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT

SHALL SEND THE MEMBER A COPY OF THE CHARGES AGAINST THE MEMBER AND GIVE THE MEMBER AN OPPORTUNITY WITHIN 10 DAYS TO REQUEST A HEARING.
(3) IF THE MEMBER REQUESTS A HEARING WITHIN THE 10-DAY (I) THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT PROMPTLY SHALL HOLD A
HEARING, BUT A HEARING MAY NOT BE SET WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER THE STATE
SUPERINTENDENT SENDS THE MEMBER A NOTICE OF THE HEARING; AND
(II) THE MEMBER SHALL HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD PUBLICLY BEFORE THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT IN HIS OWN DEFENSE, IN PERSON OR BY COUNSEL.
(4) IF A MEMBER WHO IS REMOVED SO REQUESTS, THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL FILE WITH THE CLERK OF THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR THE COUNTY FROM WHICH THE MEMBER WAS ELECTED:
(I) A COMPLETE STATEMENT OF ALL CHARGES MADE AGAINST

THE MEMBER;
(II) THE FINDINGS OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT; AND
(III) A COMPLETE RECORD OF THE PROCEEDINGS.
(d) (1) The student member shall:
(i) BE APPOINTED BY THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE;
(II) Be an eleventh or twelfth grade student in the Baltimore County
public school system;
[(ii)] (III) Serve for 1 year; and
[(iii)] (IV) Advise the Board on the thoughts and feelings of students.
(2) Unless invited to attend by an affirmative vote of a majority of the County Board, the student member may not attend an executive session that relates to:
(i) Hearings on appeals of special education placements;
(ii) Hearings held under § 6-202(a) of this article; or
(iii) Collective bargaining.

(j) The Council shall:
(1) Meet as needed to compile the number of spaces in the public schools of the County that are not filled and to evaluate the feasibility of the utilization of the spaces by the community and County departments; and
(2) Report its findings and recommendations to the County Boardof Education and the County Executive at least twice during the school year.
(k) The County Executive may, by executive order, appoint up to two additional members to the Council from agencies of the County government.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding § 3-2A-01(b) of the Education Article, the initial terms of members of the Baltimore County Board of Education elected in November 1998 shall be as follows:
(1) (i) The four members who received the highest number of votes among the members elected from districts shall each serve a term of 4 years; and
(ii) The three remaining members elected from districts shall each serve a 2 term of 2 years.
(ii) The two remaining members elected at large shall each serve a term of 2

36 years.
(3) After the initial term, each term shall be 4 years.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the members of the 39 Baltimore County Board of Education serving on June 30, 1998 shall continue to serve

1 until December 1, 1998, at which time the terms of all incumbent appointed members of 2 the Board shall terminate.

3 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 July 1, 1998.
