10	(A) THE BALTIMORE COUNTY BOARD CONSISTS OF 12 MEMBERS AS FOLLOWS:
11	(1) FOUR ELECTED FROM THE ENTIRE COUNTY AT LARGE;
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(2) ONE ELECTED FROM EACH OF THE SEVEN COUNCILMANIC 12 13 DISTRICTS IN BALTIMORE COUNTY: AND

14 (3) ONE STUDENT MEMBER APPOINTED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (E) 15 OF THIS SECTION, FROM THE COUNTY AT LARGE.

(B) (1) EACH MEMBER SERVES FOR A TERM OF 4 YEARS BEGINNING ON 16 17 THE FIRST TUESDAY IN DECEMBER AFTER THE MEMBER'S ELECTION AND UNTIL A 18 SUCCESSOR IS ELECTED AND QUALIFIES.

(2) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE 19 20 TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD ON DECEMBER 1, 1998.

21 (3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A 22 SUCCESSOR IS ELECTED AND QUALIFIES.

(4) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A QUALIFIED INDIVIDUAL TO FILL 23 24 ANY VACANCY ON THE COUNTY BOARD FOR THE REMAINDER OF THAT TERM AND 25 UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS ELECTED AND QUALIFIES.

(5) (I) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF 26 27 THIS PARAGRAPH AND UNLESS OTHERWISE DISQUALIFIED UNDER THIS SECTION, A 28 MEMBER OF THE COUNTY BOARD IS ELIGIBLE FOR REELECTION.

4 One member shall be selected from each legislative district of Baltimore County with the
5 approval of the State Senator from that district. Each legislative district representative
6 shall reside in that district;

7 (2) The initial members selected to represent legislative districts 5, 7, 9, and 8 11 shall each serve for a 2-year term beginning June 1, 1979, and ending May 31, 1981. 9 Thereafter all members shall be selected to serve 2-year terms. The initial members 10 selected to represent legislative districts 8, 10, 12, and 13 shall each serve for a 1-year 11 term beginning June 1, 1979, and ending May 31, 1980, and thereafter all members shall 12 be selected for 2-year terms;

(3) A citizen member shall be entitled to attend and vote at a Council
session where an issue before the Council concerns the school or schools in the citizen
member's respective district; and

16 (4) When the Council meets to consider countywide issues, all selected17 citizen members shall be entitled to attend such sessions and vote.

18 (j) The Council shall:

(1) Meet as needed to compile the number of spaces in the public schools ofthe County that are not filled and to evaluate the feasibility of the utilization of the spacesby the community and County departments; and

(2) Report its findings and recommendations to the County Boardof23 Education and the County Executive at least twice during the school year.

(k) The County Executive may, by executive order, appoint up to two additionalmembers to the Council from agencies of the County government.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding §
3-2A-01(b) of the Education Article, the initial terms of members of the Baltimore
County Board of Education elected in November 1998 shall be as follows:

(1) (i) The four members who received the highest number of votes among themembers elected from districts shall each serve a term of 4 years; and

31 (ii) The three remaining members elected from districts shall each serve a32 term of 2 years.

(2) (i) The two members who received the highest number of votes among themembers elected at large shall each serve a term of 4 years; and

(ii) The two remaining members elected at large shall each serve a term of 2years.

37 (3) After the initial term, each term shall be 4 years.

38 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the members of the 39 Baltimore County Board of Education serving on June 30, 1998 shall continue to serve

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- 1 until December 1, 1998, at which time the terms of all incumbent appointed members of 2 the Board shall terminate.
- 3 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 4 July 1, 1998.
