2 Pharmacists - Licensure - Oral Competency Exams

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Pharmacy to waive certain
- 4 qualifications for a license to practice pharmacy under certain circumstances;
- 5 requiring applicants for a license to practice pharmacy to demonstrate oral
- 6 competency in the English language; requiring the Board to adopt certain
- 7 regulations; requiring certain licensees to pass a certain test; making a certain
- 8 exception; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the requirement that
- 9 applicants for a license to practice pharmacy demonstrate oral competency in the
- 10 English language.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article - Health Occupations**

- 19 12-302.
- 20 (a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the
- 21 requirements of this section.
- 22 (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.
- (c) The applicant shall be at least 18 years old.
- 24 (d) The applicant shall:
- 25 (1) Be a graduate of a school or college of pharmacy that is approved by the
- 26 Board or accredited by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education; and
- 27 (2) Have completed the clinical pharmacy training that the Board requires.
- (e) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass an
- 29 examination given by the Board under this subtitle.

- 1 (F) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "FOREIGN SCHOOL OR COLLEGE OF
- 2 PHARMACY" MEANS A SCHOOL OR COLLEGE OF PHARMACY THAT IS NOT LOCATED
- 3 IN ANY STATE IN THE UNITED STATES.
- 4 (2) THE BOARD MAY WAIVE THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (D)(1)
- 5 OF THIS SECTION FOR AN APPLICANT WHO IS A GRADUATE OF A FOREIGN SCHOOL
- 6 OR COLLEGE OF PHARMACY, PROVIDED THAT THE APPLICANT PASSES AN
- 7 EXAMINATION APPROVED BY THE BOARD IN ADDITION TO THE EXAMINATIONS
- 8 OTHERWISE GIVEN BY THE BOARD UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.
- 9 (G) (1) THE BOARD SHALL REQUIRE, AS PART OF ITS EXAMINATION OR
- 10 LICENSING PROCEDURES, AN APPLICANT FOR A LICENSE TO PRACTICE PHARMACY
- 11 TO DEMONSTRATE AN ORAL COMPETENCY IN THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE BY PASSING
- 12 A BOARD APPROVED STANDARDIZED TEST OF ORAL COMPETENCY.
- 13 (2) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT ESTABLISH A
- 14 PROCEDURE FOR TESTING AN INDIVIDUAL WHO BECAUSE OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S
- 15 SPEECH IMPAIRMENT IS UNABLE TO COMPLETE SATISFACTORILY A BOARD
- 16 APPROVED STANDARDIZED TEST OF ORAL COMPETENCY.
- 17 (3) IF ANY DISCIPLINARY CHARGE OR ACTION THAT RELATES TO A
- 18 PROBLEM WITH THE ORAL COMMUNICATION OF THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE IS
- 19 BROUGHT AGAINST A LICENSEE UNDER THIS TITLE, THE BOARD SHALL REQUIRE
- 20 THE LICENSEE TO PASS A BOARD APPROVED STANDARDIZED TEST OF ORAL
- 21 COMPETENCY.
- 22 (4) THE BOARD MAY NOT REQUIRE AN APPLICANT FOR A LICENSE TO
- 23 PRACTICE PHARMACY, WHO WAS PREVIOUSLY LICENSED IN ANOTHER STATE TO
- 24 PRACTICE PHARMACY, TO DEMONSTRATE AN ORAL COMPETENCY IN THE ENGLISH
- 25 LANGUAGE, IF THE OTHER STATE'S EXAMINATION AND LICENSING PROCEDURES AT
- $26\,$ THE TIME THE APPLICANT WAS LICENSED IN THE OTHER STATE INCLUDED AN ORAL
- 27 COMPETENCY COMPONENT SIMILAR TO THE ORAL COMPETENCY COMPONENT IN 28 THIS STATE'S EXAMINATION AND LICENSING PROCEDURES.
- 29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 30 October 1, 1996.
