 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
3 Article - Health Occupations
4 [12-305.
5 (a) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board may make a reciprocal 6 agreement with any other state to waive any examination requirement of this title for an 7 individual who is licensed to practice pharmacy in that state.
8 (b) An agreement made under this section may allow the Board to grant a waiver 9 only if the individual:
10 (1) Is of good moral character;
11 (2) Pays the application fee set by the Board; and
12 (3) Provides adequate evidence that:
 (i) At the time the applicant was licensed in the other state, the applicant was qualified to take the examination that then was required by the laws of this State; and
16 (ii) The applicant qualified for a license in the other state by passing 17 an examination administered in that or any other state.
 (c) An agreement may be made with another state under this section only if, under the agreement, the other state waives the examination of licensees of this State to a similar extent as this State waives the examination requirements for individuals licensed in that state.]

 (A) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION, THE BOARD MAY WAIVE ANY EXAMINATION REQUIREMENT OF THIS TITLE FOR AN APPLICANT WHO IS LICENSED TO PRACTICE PHARMACY IN ANY OTHER STATE, IF THAT STATE GRANTS A SIMILAR WAIVER TO LICENSEES OF THIS STATE.
(B) THE BOARD MAY GRANT A WAIVER UNDER THIS SECTION ONLY IF THEAPPLICANT:
29 (1) IS OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER;
30 (2) PAYS THE APPLICATION FEE SET BY THE BOARD; AND
31 (3) PROVIDES ADEQUATE EVIDENCE THAT THE APPLICANT:
32 (I) MEETS THE QUALIFICATIONS OTHERWISE REQUIRED BY THIS 33 TITLE; AND
 (II) BECAME LICENSED OR REGISTERED IN THE OTHER STATE TO PRACTICE PHARMACY ONLY AFTER PASSING AN EXAMINATION THAT IS APPROVED BY THE BOARD.

	(C) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT BY REGULATION AN EXAMINATION TO BE ADMINISTERED TO APPLICANTS WHO ARE LICENSED TO PRACTICE PHARMACY IN ANY OTHER STATE.

	(a) [Unless a license is renewed for a 2-year term as provided in this section, the license expires on the first September 30 that comes after the effective date of the license.]
8 9	(1) A LICENSE EXPIRES ON THE DATE SET BY THE BOARD UNLESS IT IS RENEWED FOR AN ADDITIONAL TERM AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.
10 11	(2) A LICENSE MAY NOT BE RENEWED FOR A TERM LONGER THAN 2 YEARS.
	(b) At least 1 month before the license expires, the Board shall send to the licensee, by first-class mail to the last known address of the licensee, a renewal notice that states:
15	(1) The date on which the current license expires;
16 17	(2) The date by which the renewal application must be received by the Board for the renewal to be issued and mailed before the license expires; and
18	(3) The amount of the renewal fee.
19 20	(c) Before the license expires, the licensee periodically may renew it for an additional [2-year] term SET BY THE BOARD IN ITS REGULATIONS, if the licensee:
21	(1) Otherwise is entitled to be licensed;
22	(2) Pays to the Board a renewal fee set by the Board; and
23	(3) Submits to the Board:
24	(i) A renewal application on the form that the Board requires; and
25 26	(ii) Satisfactory evidence of compliance with the continuing education requirements set under this subtitle for license renewal.
27 28	(d) The Board shall renew the license of and issue a renewal certificate to each licensee who meets the requirements of this section.
31 32 33 34	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of Pharmacy shall adopt and publish regulations to govern the transition to the new expiration date for licenses to be set by the Board. These regulations shall provide for continuing education requirements and the assessment of license renewalfees that take into account the period between the former expiration date of September30 and the new expiration date to be set by the Board. The license renewal fees and continuing education requirements shall be consistent with the fee schedules and continuing education

- 1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 2 October 1, 1996.
