**Bv: Delegate Exum** Introduced and read first time: February 5, 1996 Assigned to: Economic Matters Committee Report: Favorable with amendments House action: Adopted Read second time: March 7, 1996 CHAPTER \_\_\_\_ 1 AN ACT concerning 2 Licensing and Regulation - State Board of Heating, Ventilation, Air-Conditioning, and 3 **Refrigeration Contractors** 4 FOR the purpose of altering certain conditions relating to the authority of the State Board of Heating, Ventilation, Air-Conditioning, and Refrigeration Contractors to 5 6 waive certain licensing requirements; authorizing the Board of Heating, Ventilation, 7 Air-Conditioning, and Refrigeration to give credit toward licensure for certain 8 experience under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to give credit toward 9 licensure for certain experience; prohibiting the Board from increasing certain fees 10 before a certain date; and generally relating to the licensure of heating, ventilation, 11 air-conditioning, and refrigeration contractors. 12 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 13 Article - Business Regulation 14 Section 9A-302 and 9A-305 15 Annotated Code of Maryland 16 (1992 Volume and 1995 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 19 **Article - Business Regulation** 20 9A-302. 21 (a) To qualify for an apprentice, journeyman, master, master restricted, or limited 22 license, an applicant shall meet the requirements of this section. (b) An applicant for a master heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and

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3 4 5	(1) have been regularly and principally employed in providing heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, or refrigeration services under a journeyman, limited, or master restricted license for not less than 3 years of active experience under the direction and control of a master heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and refrigeration contractor and have been so employed for not less than 1,875 hours in the year prior to application; and
7	(2) pass an examination administered by the Board.
8 9	(c) An applicant for a master restricted heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and refrigeration contractor license shall:
12 13 14	(1) have been regularly and principally employed in providing refrigeration, air-conditioning, forced air heating, hydronic heating, or ventilation services under a journeyman, limited, or master restricted license for not less than 3 years of active experience under the direction and control of a master or master restricted heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and refrigeration contractor and have been so employed for not less than 1,875 hours in the year prior to application; and
16	(2) pass an examination administered by the Board.
17 18	(d) An applicant for a limited heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and refrigeration license shall:
21 22 23	(1) have been regularly and principally employed in providing forced air heating, hydronic HEATING, ventilation, air-conditioning, or refrigeration services under a journeyman license for not less than 2 years of active experience under the direction and control of the holder of a master, master restricted, or limited license under this title, and have been so employed for not less than 1,000 hours in the year prior to application; and
25	(2) pass an examination administered by the Board.
26	(e) An applicant for a journeyman license shall:
29	(1) have held, for a period of at least 3 years, an apprentice license, and during that period shall have completed at least 1,875 hours of training in providing heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and refrigeration services under the direction and control of a licensed contractor; and
31	(2) pass an examination administered by the Board.
	(f) (1) The Board may credit not more than 3 years of formal course of study or professional training in heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, or refrigeration services if, in the opinion of the Board, the study or training provided comparable experience.

11 (a) Subject to the limitations in [subsections (b) and (c)] SUBSECTION (B) of this	
12 section, on the affirmative vote of at least a majority of the authorized membership of the	
13 Board, the Board may waive the examination requirements of this title for an individual	
14 who is licensed in another state to provide heating, ventilation, air conditioning, or	
15 refrigeration services as a journeyman, master, master restricted, or limited heating,	
16 ventilation, air conditioning, and refrigeration contractor.	
17 (b) The Board may grant a waiver under this section only if the applicant:	
18 (1) pays the appropriate application fee required by § 9A 303 of this title;	
19 and	
20 (2) provides adequate evidence that the applicant:	
21 (i) meets the qualifications otherwise required by this title;	
22 (ii) holds an active license in good standing in the otherstate;	
23 (iii) holds a license that is equivalent to the State license; and	
24 (iv) became licensed in the other state after meeting, in that state,	
25 requirements that are at least equivalent to the licensing requirements of this State,	
26 including the number of years of work experience equivalent to the experience required	
27 under § 9A 302(b), (c), and (d) of this title.	
28 [(c) The Board may grant a waiver only if the state in which the applicant is	
29 licensed waives the examination of licensees of this State to a similar extent as this State	
30 waives the examination requirements for individuals licensed in that state.]	
31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding the	
32 provisions of § 9A-207(a) or (b) of the Business Regulation Article, before January 1,	
33 1997 the State Board of Heating, Ventilation, Air-Conditioning, and Refrigeration	
34 Contractors may not increase any application fees or other fees under Title 9A of the	
35 Business Regulation Article for the issuance and renewal of licenses or for its other	
36 services.
