- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to establish by
- 4 ordinance a certain authority; specifying the purpose of an authority established
- 5 under this Act; establishing certain powers and duties of an authority established
- 6 under this Act; providing that the Mayor and City Council are authorized to provide
- 7 funding and services for an authority established under this Act; and generally
- 8 relating to the establishment, authority, funding, and operations of a certain
- 9 authority within Baltimore City.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 The Charter of Baltimore City

18 Article II - General Powers

- 19 The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall have full power and authority to
- 20 exercise all of the powers heretofore or hereafter granted to it by the Constitution of
- 21 Maryland or by any Public General or Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland; and in
- 22 particular, without limitation upon the foregoing, shall have power by ordinance, or such
- 23 other method as may be provided for in its Charter, subject to the provisions of said
- 24 Constitution and Public General Laws:
- 25 (64) (A) TO ESTABLISH BY ORDINANCE AN AUTHORITY KNOWN AS
- 26 "CHILDREN FIRST" THAT USES EXISTING FACILITIES FOR THE PURPOSE OF
- 27 PROVIDING RECREATIONAL, CULTURAL, AND OTHER ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS FOR
- 28 CHILDREN.

1	(B) THE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION:
2	(1) IS AN INDEPENDENT UNIT OF THE BALTIMORE CITY GOVERNMENT;
	(2) SHALL HAVE THOSE POWERS AND DUTIES CONSISTENT WITH THE PURPOSES OF THE AUTHORITY, DELEGATED THROUGH THE ORDINANCE THAT THE CITY ITSELF COULD OTHERWISE EXERCISE; AND
	(3) IS EXEMPT FROM THOSE LAWS OR PROCEDURES THAT WOULD OTHERWISE APPLY TO ANY UNIT OF THE BALTIMORE CITY GOVERNMENT TO THE EXTENT EXEMPTED BY THE ORDINANCE.
10	(C) THE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION:
11 12	(1) SHALL HAVE A MANAGEMENT BOARD AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AS PRESCRIBED IN THE ORDINANCE ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION;
13	(2) MAY SUE OR BE SUED;
14 15	(3) MAY ACQUIRE, LEASE, OR HOLD PROPERTY FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE AUTHORITY;
16 17	(4) MAY INCUR LIMITED OBLIGATION DEBT THAT SHALL BE AN OBLIGATION SOLELY OF THE AUTHORITY IF AUTHORIZED BY THE ORDINANCE;
18 19	(5) MAY EMPLOY STAFF OR CONTRACT FOR ANY SERVICES NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THE AUTHORITY;
20 21	(6) MAY ADOPT BYLAWS AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE OPERATION OF THE AUTHORITY;
22 23	(7) MAY ESTABLISH FEES NECESSARY FOR THE OPERATION OF THE AUTHORITY;
24 25	(8) MAY MAKE CONTRACTS OF ANY KIND AND EXECUTE ANY INSTRUMENT NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THE AUTHORITY;
	(9) MAY ACCEPT FROM ANY PUBLIC OR PRIVATE ENTITY GRANTS OR OTHER REVENUE NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THE AUTHORITY; AND
29 30	(10) SHALL HAVE ANY ADDITIONAL POWERS GRANTED UNDER AND SUBJECT TO THE ORDINANCE ENACTED UNDER THIS SECTION.
33	(D) THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL ARE AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE AUTHORITY AND ANY SERVICES THROUGH THE CITY GOVERNMENT THAT ARE DEEMED APPROPRIATE TO ASSIST THE AUTHORITY IN ITS OPERATIONS.
