## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Milk Products - Sell-By Period

3 FOR the purpose of eliminating the authority of the Secretary of Healthand Mental

- 4 Hygiene to review the keeping quality of certain milk products, conduct certain
- 5 studies, and adopt regulations that establish the maximum length of time certain
- 6 milk products may be kept for sale; authorizing certain milk processors to determine
- 7 the length of time certain milk products may be kept for sale; eliminating certain
- 8 standards regarding the length of time certain milk products may be kept for sale;
- 9 repealing certain provisions that permit certain milk processors to apply for
- 10 permission to extend the length of time certain milk products may bekept for sale
- 11 under certain circumstances; and generally relating to certain milk products and the
- 12 length of time they may be kept for sale.

## 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 Article - Health - General

21 21-426.

(a) In this section, "sell-by period" means the length of time a Grade A milkproduct may be kept for sale.

24 (b) [The Secretary shall:

(1) Review from time to time the keeping quality of Grade A milk productsby conducting scientific shelf-life studies that recognize different methods of

27 pasteurization; and

(2) After holding a public hearing, adopt rules and regulationsthat establish
the maximum sell-by period for each kind of Grade A milk product.] EACHGRADE A
MILK PROCESSOR SHALL DETERMINE THE SELL-BY PERIOD FOR ITS PRODUCTS.

(c) (1) After a public hearing, the Secretary shall adopt rules and regulations
 that establish a method for conspicuously marking, on the Grade A milk product
 container, the last date on which the product may be sold.

4 (2) Each Grade A milk product container shall be marked as required by 5 rules and regulations adopted under this subtitle.

6 [(d) (1) A Grade A milk product that is cooled to, packaged, and stored at 45 7 degrees Fahrenheit or less before it is purchased by or delivered to the ultimate consumer 8 has a sell-by period of 7 days.

9 (2) If a scientific study justifies a modification of the temperature 10 requirements of this subsection, the Secretary, after a public hearing, may adopt rules and 11 regulations that modify the temperature requirements of this subsection.

12 (e) (1) A Grade A milk processor may apply for permission to extend the 13 sell-by period of a Grade A milk product by not more than 5 days.

(2) If an application under this subsection is supported by a scientific study
of shelf-life and the study is acceptable to the Secretary, the Secretary shall grant
permission to extend the sell-by period by not more than 5 days.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 1996.

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
