3 FOR the purpose of eliminating the authority of the Secretary of Healthand Mental

4 Hygiene to review the keeping quality of certain milk products, conduct certain

5 studies, and adopt regulations that establish the maximum length of time certain

6 milk products may be kept for sale; authorizing certain milk processors to determine

7 the length of time certain milk products may be kept for sale; eliminating altering

8 certain standards regarding the length of time certain milk productsmay be kept for

9 sale; repealing certain provisions that permit certain milk processors to apply for

10 permission to extend the length of time certain milk products may bekept for sale

11 under certain circumstances; providing for the effective date of this Act; and

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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## 1 Article - Health - General

2 21-426.

3 (a) In this section, "sell-by period" means the length of time a Grade A milk4 product may be kept for sale.

5 (b) [The Secretary shall:

6 (1) Review from time to time the keeping quality of Grade A milk products
7 by conducting scientific shelf-life studies that recognize different methods of
8 pasteurization; and

9 (2) After holding a public hearing, adopt rules and regulationsthat establish
10 the maximum sell-by period for each kind of Grade A milk product.] EACHGRADE A
11 MILK PROCESSOR SHALL DETERMINE THE SELL BY PERIOD FOR ITS PRODUCTS.

(c) (1) After a public hearing, the Secretary shall adopt rules and regulations
 that establish a method for conspicuously marking, on the Grade A milk product
 container, the last date on which the product may be sold.

15 (2) Each Grade A milk product container shall be marked as required by 16 rules and regulations adopted under this subtitle.

17 [(d) (1) (C) A Grade A milk product that is cooled to, packaged, andstored at
45 degrees Fahrenheit or less before it is purchased by or delivered to the ultimate
19 consumer has a sell-by period of 7 <u>14</u> days.

20  $\underline{(2)}$  If a scientific study justifies a modification of the temperature 21 requirements of this subsection, the Secretary, after a public hearing, may adopt rules and 22 regulations that modify the temperature requirements of this subsection.

(e) (1) A Grade A milk processor may apply for permission to extend thesell-by period of a Grade A milk product by not more than 5 days.

(2) If an application under this subsection is supported by a scientific study
of shelf-life and the study is acceptable to the Secretary, the Secretary shall grant
permission to extend the sell-by period by not more than 5 days.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October June 1, 1996.
