A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City Juvenile Justice Center - Employment Preferences**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Personnel to allow a specified number of
4 preference points in certain competitive examinations to residents of specified areas
5 for positions at the Baltimore City Juvenile Justice Center under certain
6 circumstances; and defining certain terms.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions**

15 4-205.

16 (E) (1) (I) IN THIS SUBSECTION THE FOLLOWING TERMS HAVE THE
17 MEANINGS INDICATED.

18 (II) "ADJACENT DISTRICT" MEANS A LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT
19 WITHIN BALTIMORE CITY ADJACENT TO THE HOST DISTRICT OR, IF THE ADJACENT
20 DISTRICT EXTENDS BEYOND BALTIMORE CITY, THAT PART OF THE DISTRICT
21 WITHIN BALTIMORE CITY.

22 (III) "HOST DISTRICT" MEANS THE LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT IN
23 WHICH THE BALTIMORE CITY JUVENILE JUSTICE CENTER IS LOCATED.

24 (2) IN A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR AN INITIAL APPOINTMENT
25 TO ANY POSITION AT THE BALTIMORE CITY JUVENILE JUSTICE CENTER, THE
26 SECRETARY SHALL ALLOW FIVE PREFERENCE POINTS TO EACH RESIDENT OF THE
27 HOST DISTRICT OR AN ADJACENT DISTRICT IF, IN THE MOST RECENT 12-MONTH
28 PERIOD FOR WHICH DATA IS AVAILABLE AS REPORTED BY THE MARYLAND
29 DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AND EMPLOYMENT DEVELOPMENT, BALTIMORE CITY

1 HAD AN AVERAGE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE THAT IS MORE THAN ONE AND
2 ONE-HALF TIMES THE STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AS A WHOLE.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
4 October 1, 1996.
