A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Health Occupations - Pharmacies - Prescription Drug Plans

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain pharmacies to offer the State's prescription drug

- 4 benefit plan the same reimbursement level that the pharmacy offers to certain other
- 5 persons; and generally relating to pharmacies.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 Article - Health Occupations

19 12-403.

20 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a pharmacy for which a pharmacy 21 permit has been issued under this title:

(1) Shall be operated in compliance with the law and with the rules andregulations of the Board;

24 (2) Shall be located and equipped so that the pharmacy may be operated 25 without endangering the public health or safety;

26 (3) Shall be constantly under the personal and immediate supervision of a27 licensed pharmacist;

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| 1 (4) Shall provide complete pharmaceutical service by preparing and 2 dispensing all prescriptions that reasonably may be expected of a pharmacist; |
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| 3 (5) Except for a hospital pharmacy, shall provide services to the general 4 public and may not restrict or limit its services to any group of individuals; |
| (6) May not offer pharmaceutical services under any term or condition that tends to interfere with or impair the free and complete exercise of professional pharmaceutical judgment or skill; |
| 8 (7) May not make any agreement that denies a patient a free choice of 9 pharmacists; [and] |
| 10 (8) May not participate in any activity that is a ground for Board action 11 against a licensed pharmacist under § 12-313 of this title; AND |
| (9) SHALL OFFER THE STATE'S PRESCRIPTION DRUG BENEFIT PLAN THE SAME REIMBURSEMENT LEVEL THAT THE PHARMACY OFFERS TO OTHER PLANS OR PROGRAMS IN THE STATE OR IN OTHER ARRANGEMENTS IN THE STATE. |

| 16 Subject to the hearing provisions of § 12-411 of this subtitle, the Board may suspend 17 or revoke any pharmacy permit, if the pharmacy: |
| 18 (1) Is conducted so as to endanger the public health or safety; |
| 19 (2) Violates any of the standards specified in § 12-403 of thissubtitle; or |
| 20 (3) Otherwise is not conducted in accordance with the law. |

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

22 October 1, 1996.

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
