- 4 FOR the purpose of allowing a State employee who is a member of the Employees'
- 5 Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Teachers' Retirement
- 6 System, or the Teachers' Pension System to retire if the member has a minimum
- 7 number of years of eligibility service and the member is separated from employment
- 8 as a result of the elimination of the member's position by an Act of the General
- 9 Assembly; providing for a certain reduction in the retirement allowance under
- 10 certain circumstances; and making this Act an emergency measure.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (A) A MEMBER WHO IS A STATE EMPLOYEE MAY RETIRE WITH AN EARLY
- 21 SERVICE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE IF:
- 22 (1) THE STATE EMPLOYEE IS SEPARATED FROM EMPLOYMENT AS A
- 23 RESULT OF THE EMPLOYEE'S POSITION BEING ELIMINATED BY AN ACT OF THE
- 24 GENERAL ASSEMBLY;

1 2	(2) ON OR BEFORE THE DATE OF RETIREMENT, THE MEMBER HAS AT LEAST 20 YEARS OF ELIGIBILITY SERVICE; AND
	(3) THE MEMBER COMPLETES AND SUBMITS A WRITTEN APPLICATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES STATING THE DATE WHEN THE MEMBER DESIRES TO RETIRE.
8	(B) ON RETIREMENT UNDER THIS SECTION, A MEMBER IS ENTITLED TO AN EARLY SERVICE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE THAT EQUALS ONE FIFTY-FIFTH OF THE MEMBER'S AVERAGE FINAL COMPENSATION MULTIPLIED BY THE NUMBER OF YEARS OF CREDITABLE SERVICE REDUCED BY THE LESSER OF:

11 12	(2) 0.5% FOR EACH MONTH BY WHICH THE MEMBER'S DATE OF RETIREMENT PRECEDES THE EARLIER OF:

17 18	(A) A MEMBER WHO IS A STATE EMPLOYEE MAY RETIRE WITH AN EARLY SERVICE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE IF:
	(1) THE STATE EMPLOYEE IS SEPARATED FROM EMPLOYMENT AS A RESULT OF THE EMPLOYEE'S POSITION BEING ELIMINATED BY AN ACT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY;
22 23	(2) ON OR BEFORE THE DATE OF RETIREMENT, THE MEMBER HAS AT LEAST 20 YEARS OF ELIGIBILITY SERVICE; AND
	(3) THE MEMBER COMPLETES AND SUBMITS A WRITTEN APPLICATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES STATING THE DATE WHEN THE MEMBER DESIRES TO RETIRE.
29	(B) ON RETIREMENT UNDER THIS SECTION, A MEMBER IS ENTITLED TO RECEIVE AN EARLY SERVICE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE THAT EQUALS THE NORMAL SERVICE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE UNDER § 23-401 OF THIS SUBTITLE, REDUCED BY THE LESSER OF:
31	(1) 42%; OR
32 33	(2) 0.5% FOR EACH MONTH THAT THE MEMBER'S EARLY RETIREMENT DATE PRECEDES THE DATE THE MEMBER WILL BE 62 YEARS OLD.
36 37	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
